Dr. Poor holds the Doctor of Music Education, as well as, the Master of Music in Trumpet Performance from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and he previously received the Bachelor of Music Education degree (*High Honors*) from the University of Florida, Gainesville, Florida.

In providing service to music education, Dr. Poor has served Georgia Music Educators Association in a variety of capacities including serving as, District 6 High School Honor Band organizer, an All-State Band Organizer, a former member of the Band Adjudication Committee, and as both a concert and sight-reading adjudicator for both middle school and high school Large Group Performance Evaluation events.
