

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

This was a very unusual month for all of us. Because of a combination of vacations, holidays and Covid exposures, we were not able to have services, either in person or online for 3 weeks in a row. We thank all of you who stuck with us and came back in even greater numbers as we resumed services as usual on Jan 14 and 21st.

Antisemitism hit close to home last weekend with the distribution of antisemitic flyers. A police report was made by a congregant, and I have been in contact with the Whittier, Chief of Police, Aviv Bar. This is from his email to me.

I wanted to let you know that over the weekend, we had a distribution of antisemitic flyers in a neighborhood on the east side of the city, covering 4 streets. This despicable act is taking place in various cities and has been reported in the news in recent weeks.

These organizations or sometimes a loose group of individuals distribute such literature so it can receive news coverage and be posted on social media, further advertising their ideology and organization name.

With the recent incident at Beth Israel in Texas, we have briefed our teams about your services on Friday nights for situational awareness.

We continue to have security at all our services and the gate around the churchyard has been very helpful in providing an added measure of security.

On a lighter note, we are making progress with our display cabinet project and hopefully when it is completed, we will have an open house to show off our newly renovated offices.

We are also planning on another dinner soon, perhaps Italian this time. It all depends on when we feel it is safe to get together again.

SABBATH - A Day of Freedom

<u>Life in Egypt:</u> as you remember from our Torah the Israelites were enslaved by Pharoah. They were subjected to his cruel rule against their lives. They labored 24/7 in the hot sun building the cities of Pithom and Rameses. They lived in a world without freedom as this was the privilege of their masters. The day of Sabbath, a day to spend with the family, forgetting the weeks worries, in essences to relax at home, and devote oneself to holy things was unheard of. Pharoah did not realize that had he given the Israelis a day of rest, once a week, they would return to work with renewed strength and vigor. They would be able to work harder, much better, a new way of life. The time came, however, for the Israelites to give up the above way of life. The Torah was to be their guide and Moses their leader and teacher.

The Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness learning the "Mitzvos" of the Torah from Moses. Day after day they came to him with their problems and he judged them according to the laws he had learned from G-d. A new Torah way of life they learned was a wonderful experience.

<u>The Mitzvah of Shabbos</u>: one Mitzvah that shone above all others was the Mitzvah of Shabbos. This was a Mitzvah to G-d, his personal one, it was destined to revolutionize the life of the Israelites and eventually almost the entire civilized world.

"Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but, the seventh day shall be the sabbath in honor of the Lord your G-d, on it you shall not do any work...and you shall remember that you were a servant in the land of Egypt and that the Lord your G-d brought you out from there by a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore has the Lord your G-d commanded you to observe the Sabbath day." (D'vorim 5:13 - 16)

Just think how far advanced our Torah is to have introduced the seventh day as a day of spiritual and physical rest more than 3000 years ago. How long it took humanity to learn this lesson taught us by G-d!

What is the beauty of Shabbos? How can it make us free? The answer to these questions will be given and discussed in the March edition of the Mishpacha.
