# THE WEDDING SINGER 2020





WHAT DO YOU THINK OF WHEN SOMEONE SAYS "GREASE?" THE MOVIE? THE MOST RECENT REVIVAL? THE ORIGINAL CHICAGO PRODUCTION? WHICHEVER ONE IS FIRST, CHANCES ARE HAND-JIVES, SUMMER LOVIN,' AND SANDY'S ICONIC "BAD GIRL" OUTFIT ARE JUST A FEW OF THE THINGS THAT COME TO MIND. GREASE, AND IT'S BELOVED PINK LADIES AND T-BIRDS (OR BURGER PALACE BOYS, AS THEY WERE ORIGINALLY CALLED), HAVE HAD A LONG JOURNEY FROM CHICAGO TO THE RINGWOOD STAGE!



CHICAGO - 1971

THE ORIGINAL PRODUCTION OF GREASE PREMIERED IN CHICAGO USA IN 1971. THE SCRIPT WAS BASED ON JIM JACOBS'S EXPERIENCE AT WILLIAM TAFT HIGH SCHOOL IN CHICAGO. JACOBS, ALONG WITH WARREN CASEY, PENNED THE BOOK, LYRICS, AND MUSIC. THE SCHOOL BECAME RYDELL HIGH SCHOOL, AND THE STORY OF TEN TEENAGERS IN THE '50S, NAVIGATING THE CHALLENGES OF PEER PRESSURE, LOVE, AND IDENTITY, TOOK TO THE STAGE FOR THE FIRST TIME. THE ORIGINAL CHICAGO PRODUCTION WAS ROUGH, AGGRESSIVE, AND PURPOSELY VULGAR; FULL OF CURSING, SEX, AND GRIT.

#### OFF-BROADWAY - 1972

THE CHICAGO PRODUCTION CAUGHT THE EYES OF BROADWAY PRODUCERS WHO DECIDED TO BRING THE SHOW TO NEW YORK. DURING THE MOVE, GREASE BECAME LESS GRITTY AND LESS CHICAGO-SPECIFIC, SMOOTHING SOME OF THE ORIGINAL'S ROUGHER EDGES. IT WAS PRODUCED OFF-BROADWAY AND OPENED ON FEBRUARY 14, 1972. THE OFF-BROADWAY PRODUCTION, ALTHOUGH NOT LOCATED IN THE THEATRE DISTRICT, OPENED UNDER FIRST CLASS BROADWAY CONTRACTS, AND AS A RESULT WAS ELIGIBLE FOR THE 1972 TONY AWARDS, RECEIVING SEVEN TONY NOMINATIONS.

#### BROADWAY - 1972 - 1980

GREASE EVENTUALLY MOVED UPTOWN, AND OFFICIALLY OPENED ON BROADWAY. THE SHOW STARRED BARRY BOSTWICK AS DANNY AND CAROLE DEMAS AS SANDY. BOSTWICK WENT ON TO PLAY BRAD MAJORS IN THE ROCKY HORROR PICTURE SHOW, AND DEMAS WENT ON TO ORIGINATE THE LEAD ROLE IN THE BAKER'S WIFE. GREASE PLAYED UNTILL 1980. NOTABLE REPLACEMENTS DURING IT'S EIGHT YEAR RUN INCLUDED PETER GALLAGHER, PATRICK SWAYZE, AND JOHN TRAVOLTA. AND RICHARD GERE.

MOVIE - 1978

#### THIS WAS THE GAME CHANGER! THE FILM ADAPTATION WAS RELEASED



IN 1978, SIX YEARS AFTER GREASE MADE IT'S NEW YORK DEBUT. THE MOVIE STARRED JOHN TRAVOLTA, WHO PLAYED DOODY DURING THE SHOW'S BROADWAY RUN, AND OLIVIA NEWTON-JOHN. THE CASTING OF OLIVIA NEWTON-JOHN, AN AUSTRALIAN, LEAD TO A CHANGE IN THE CHARACTER FROM AMERICAN SANDY DUMBROWSKI, TO SANDY OLSON, AN AUSTRALIAN ON HOLIDAY WHO MOVES TO AMERICA WITH HER FAMILY. GREASE WAS THE BIGGEST BOX OFFICE HIT OF 1978, AND IT'S SOUNDTRACK WAS THE SECOND-BEST SELLING ALBUM IN THE UNITED STATES THAT YEAR. SEVERAL SONGS, SCENES AND PLOTLINES WERE

ADDED TO FLESH OUT THE STAGE VERSION. "SANDY", "YOU'RE THE ONE That I want" and "hopelessly devoted to you were added.

#### **BROADWAY REVIVAL - 1994**

THE FIRST BROADWAY REVIVAL OF GREASE OPENED AT THE EUGENE O'NEILL THEATRE ON MAY 11TH, 1994. THIS RUN FEATURED PROMINENT HOLLYWOOD AND BROADWAY ACTORS SUCH AS BROOK SHIELDS, ROSIE O'DONNELL, MEGAN MULLALLY, AND BILLY PORTER. WHILE THIS REVIVAL DID NOT INCLUDE ANY SONGS ADDED TO THE MOVIE, IT DID INCLUDE "SINCE I DON'T HAVE YOU," A SONG FROM THE 50'S, AS A BALLAD FOR SANDY TO SING, INSTEAD OF "HOPELESSLY DEVOTED TO YOU." THE REVIVAL RAN UNTIL 1998, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,505 PERFORMANCES.

#### **AUSSIE GREASE - 1998**

WITH SEVERAL SUCCESSFUL PROFESSIONAL TRADITIONAL STAGE Productions under Australia's Belt, 1998 Saw John Frost, Produce grease — The Arena Spectacular. Giving Credence To the Saying that 'Bigger is Better'. This

VERSION FEATURED A MASSIVE CAST IN ARENAS HOLDING UP TO 20,000 PEOPLE. STARRING CRAIG MCLACHLAN AS DANNY, JANE SCALI AS SANDY AND DANNII MINOGUE AS RIZZO, THE PRODUCTION TOURED AROUND AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND, TAKING OVER \$19 MILLION IN





ANTHONY WARLOW FEATURED AS THE TEEN ANGEL AND FLEW DOWN FROM THE RAFTERS RESPLENDENT IN WHITE WITH GIGANTIC FEATHERED WINGS. HE WAS ALSO GIVEN AN EXTRA SONG, THE CLASSIC MY PRAYER.

IN 2005, THE NEW ARENA SPECTACULAR PRODUCTION WENT ON THE ROAD AGAIN FEATURING (AT THE TIME) NEIGHBOURS STAR NATALIE BASSINGTHWAIGHTE AS SANDY. STEPPING INTO THE TEEN ANGEL'S SHOES WAS 'THE VOICE' JOHN FARNHAM. THE COMPANY ALSO FEATURED TOBY ALLEN AS KENICKIE, ROB MILLS AS JOHNNY CASINO, MAGDA SZUBANSKI AS MISS LYNCH AND TAMSIN CARROLL AS RIZZO.

#### **BROADWAY REVIVAL - 2007**

# SYNOPSIS



With the sound of rock and roll music flowing into our ears, the most colorful members of the class of '59 enter in "Grease is the Word." The "greasers," comprised of the T-Birds and the Pink Ladies tell about the "groove and meaning" of Grease. The scene transitions to the first day of senior year, September, 1958. The high school cafeteria bustles with kids groaning about the annual return to lousy food and dreaded teachers.

The Pink Ladies sit on one side of the lunchroom, and the T-Birds sit on the other. There's a new girl in town, Sandy Olsen, who shares the details of her summer romance with the Pink Ladies.

At the same time, Danny Zuko, leader of the T-Birds, brags about his love conquest (Summer Nights). Sandy and Danny bump into each other, and while Sandy is happy to find her summer love again, Danny blows her off under the guise of



ACT 2

ACT 1

When lunch hour ends, rock star wannabe Doody gives an impromptu concert in the hall (Those Magic Changes), making it clear that grades and SAT scores aren't nearly as important as learning to play the guitar. Boys rank even more highly than songs on the Pink Ladies' charts, which is evident at Marty's pajama party, where the girls (including Sandy)

experiment with pierced ears. Rizzo is unsure about the new girl and shows off in front of the Pink Ladies (Look at Me, I'm Sandra Dee) and Marty tells about her long-distance courtship with a Marine (Freddy, My Love).

Meanwhile, the T-Birds are busy daydreaming about girls and cool cars (Greased Lightnin'). Sandy is still hurt

by Danny's brush off, but when they get a minute alone together Danny tries to explain. Head cheerleader Patty Simcox interrupts to prompt Sandy to join the squad and to tease Danny about his latest indiscretions.

The kids take their newfangled portable radios for a rock and roll picnic in the park



and plan how they'll pair off at the upcoming school dance (Mooning). Sandy passes through with valedictorian-to-be Eugene; she seems to have given up on Danny since she's found out that he has been telling his friends that she's "easy,". Rizzo teases Danny for falling for a girl who resembles the excessively proper teenage ingenue, Sandra Dee. Act I ends with almost all the couples having some sort of fight with each other, even as they proclaim (We Go Together).

When Act II begins, everyone is Shakin' at the High School Hop - everyone, that is, except Sandy. She's home asking the



stars up above why she must be a teenager in love and otherwise feeling sorry for herself (It's Raining on Prom Night). Meanwhile, all the kids are getting their kicks at the hop. The popular radio DJ - Vince Fontaine, is the MC at the dance, which takes place in the gym. He's warming the kids up for a dance contest. Kenickie, who got a blind date after the fight that ended Act I, now dumps her and pairs off with his usual thrill, Rizzo. Danny enters the contest with Kenickie's cast-off, Cha-Cha

DeGregorio, and they win (Born to Hand Jive).

As Danny and Cha-Cha leave the dance with the trophy, they see Sandy, who wonders why she is so head over heels for and foolishly in love with Danny (Hopelessly Devoted).

A few days later at the Burger Palace after school, a couple of the guys run into a dejected Frenchy who flunked out of Rydell and is now studying cosmetology. She is miraculously visited by a cheesy Teen Angel who gives ger some advice (Beauty School Dropout). Danny, who has taken up track in order to win back Sandy's affections, doesn't know that the guys have been challenged to a rumble by Cha-Cha's friends. He's more concerned about

patching things up with Sandy at the Twi-Light Drive In, but he moves too fast for her and she leaves (Sandy).

The "Greasers" are having a party, as Doody and Kenickie attempt to sing Rock and Roll Party Queen. Rizzo is worried that she's pregnant, but she's so mad at Kenickie that she tells him he's not the father. The other kids are sympathetic, but Rizzo rejects their offers of help, especially Sandy's (There Are Worse Things I Could Do). Sandy wonders what she needs to do to fit in at Rydell (Look at Me, I'm Sandra Dee Reprise).

The next time Sandy meets up with the T-Birds and the Pink Ladies, a transformation has taken place. Sandy is now a greaser's dream date, leaving Danny with multiple chills (You're the One that I Want). Rizzo is relieved to learn that she isn't pregnant, and she and Kenickie reunite. It's happily-ever-after time for all (We Go Together Reprise).

"A-wop-bop-a-loo-bop-a-wop-bam-boom!," - RSC is back in the theatre with our stage production of 50's classic 'Grease' for 2021, the first time this show has been staged at RSC. It has been a bumpy ride as we have negotiated the challenges of COVID and all that it has meant for creative pursuits in the Performing Arts space.



Denise Rash joined Extra Parts in 2009 as a parent helper. After her son started at Ringwood Secondary and received a part in the 2009 Production of 'My Fair Lady' she volunteered her skills as part of the team that work behind the scenes to create the amazing cast costumes for the shows.

She continued in 2010 when the College performed 'Crazy for You' and in 2011 she took the helm alongside Karen Carden when the college performed 'Kiss Me Kate', together they were a team, partners in crime as they refer to it! Her abilities and skills as a visionary designer creating costumes and individual looks for the 100's of students that took to the stage over the years and Karen keeping accurate lists of what costumes were needed for each show formed a winning combination.

There is a saying 'Excellence is in the details. Give attention to the details and excellence will come.' This saying is encapsulated in the mind of Denise, her attention to detail and her passion over the years has inspired the team behind her vision to assist in her creations and they would become reality.

Each costume would start as a picture in a notebook with particular attention to each fabric and embellishment that was chosen to create and complement the piece and the dream that was in her head would become a reality.

Through the years she has worked on over 15 junior and senior productions at Ringwood, highlights have included 'Hairspray', 'The Producers' and our 2015 Award Winning Show of 'Oliver' which we were all ecstatic to win the Music Guild of Victoria award for 2015 Best Junior Production! Most productions would result in an average of 250 individual costumes, but there were a few mammoth years with 'Hairspray' and 'The Producers' resulting in well over 600 costumes for our cast.



Over the time, Denise has worked with three Directors of Performing Arts, Mr Robert Motton, Mr Benjamin Moody and Mr Karl McNamara. Part of creating each production is working with them to bring their vision of the show to the stage. In later years, we have been fortunate to work on newer shows under the guidance of Karl with shows such as 'Addams Family' in 2018 and 'Spamalot' in 2019. 'Addams Family' gave Denise the freedom to create an amazing troop of individual ghostly ancestors that rose from the grave, each cast member's costume was created with numerous pieces which resulted in the audience even struggling to find their own child on stage - they were so incredible!

Along the way we have worked and still work with the most amazing team of parent helpers, who are affectionately known as 'The Tarts of Extra PArts'. We believe that there is no 'I' in TEAM and what starts with a "Denise idea" would not come to fruition without this team!



We have had some funny stories over the years, here are a few:

•Sewing money and silver paper on to skirts for 'Chicago' and wondering what the heck Denise was thinking, but once on stage - what an amazing scene!

•Sewing swastika arm bands together at 3 am for 'The Producers' when it was opening night that evening, not to mention creating 35 Grannie costumes for the stage!

•Being backstage and at the last minute having to sew a cast member into their costume when the zip had broken just before their number on stage!

• Teaching a team of 20 how to correctly affix a wig so it would stay on for 'Addams Family' when 95% of the cast had to wear a wig!

Denise Rash has definitely left a mark on the costumes for Ringwood Secondary – her attention to detail and her professionalism in the voluntary position she has held as part of the Production and team is invaluable! We thankher so much for all she has given to RSC.

We have a saying in Extra Parts - well we actually have two - the first always comes on Opening Night when we see those kids on stage and see the joy in their faces and the confidence in their steps, when they sing their songs and dance their feet off and show how proud they are to wear their costumes - 'We Did Good'. The team all know that the time our students spend as part of these amazing productions will become memories that they will treasure for years to come as part of their schooling at Ringwood Secondary.

The second is 'Once a Tart Always a Tart' – so Denise will **always** be always part of our team, even after her children have completed their journey at Ringwood Secondary College.


