GENERAL PLAN UPDATE:



City staff are updating the **Energy and Climate Action Element** (ECAP), **Climate Action Plan** (CAP), and **Economic Development Element** (EDE) that comprise the first phase of the City's comprehensive General Plan.

Together, the ECAP and CAP outline a vision for Oceanside's sustainable future that involves enhanced energy efficiency, greater access to clean and renewable energy, more mobility options, an expanded urban forest, local food sourcing, and less reliance on non renewable resources.

DID YOU KNOW....

This will be a record "bloom" year for native wildflowers!. Where to see the blooms?

Anza Borrego State Park is fairly close and has a wide variety of wildflowers that bloom over a 2-3 week period. Go to the Visitors Center past many of the widely blooming areas and will also allow you to see the names of the flowers. Parks.ca.gov/anzaborrego

Traffic on weekends is frustratingly slow so get a really early start and beat the heat, and bring lots of H20.

The Antelope Valley California Poppy Reserve near Lancaster features the State flower in gorgeous profusion. Call for bloom status: 661-724-1180.

Can't drive far? Drive up Hwy 15 and view the poppies and other wildflowers on the hills on the East side of the freeway. Best bloom is just past Lake Elsinore Outlets, but there is a good patch right after the entrance of 76 onto I-15 N.

Better yet – attend the Seaside's Native Plant Walking tour through the neighborhood on March 31. This is a free tour lasting about 1.5 hours and led by native plant experts. The tour is timed for good bloom by California native plants and **starts from St. Mary's School at 2:00 PM.**
