The Winter Challenge was a huge success. The weather was great the first two days but then became a "challenge" on the final day...There was good food, good friends, and good fun...

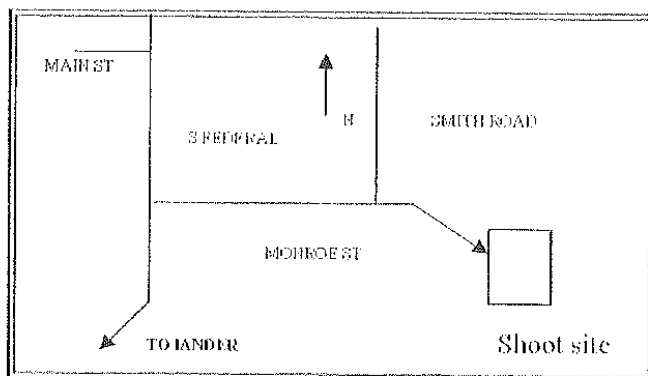

**Guns allowed:** Any front stuff gun, shotgun, trade gun, smoothbore, flint, percussion.

**Where:** Worland, Wyoming, Shooting Complex

3 miles Northwest of Worland on County Rd 15 mile Signs will be posted.

**When:** April 24-26, 2015. Range will be open at 9:00 am to 5:00 pm on Friday and Saturday. Sunday range will open from 9:00 till noon for shoot offs and awards.

**Cost:** Entry fees \$20.00 plus \$3.00 per match shot.

If you do not have a smoothbore or shotgun show up, someone will have one for you to shoot and try out. Powder, shot and caps will be available. We will accept donations to help cover the cost of the powder, shot and caps. This is a family event; we want to encourage more women and youth to participate.

Currently there are 18 scheduled matches. Women- Skeet and Trap, Men's- Skeet and Trap; and Youth-Skeet and Trap. Additional matches for Flintlock and traditional shotguns will be offered. All matches will be re-entry. You can shoot as many matches as you want cost is \$3.00 per round.

**Trap Rounds:** shoot 10-15 birds per match from 10-16 yards.

**Skeet Rounds:** will shoot 16 birds regular or 14 bird report doubles

**Lunch and drinks will be provided on Saturday. Other meals are on your own.**

Jim,

Thanks for doing the article in the current WSMLA newsletter. You asked for input so here goes. Keeping in mind, my memory is sometimes lost to what I did last year, so going back 45 years my stretch it some.

Some of us started doing the Rendezvous in the early 70's. I think the first one was in Nebraska in 1973. Then it came to Camp E-La-Cowie, (spelling is probably wrong but, that is how it is pronounced) the old Boy Scout camp in the mountains west of Buffalo. I also believe it was an NMLRA Rendezvous.

For the next few years the NMLRA Rendezvous were held in various places in Montana. One around Virginia City, MT and then one around Big Timber, I think, then in 1976 it went to Darby, MT. That one they called the Bicentennial Rendezvous. I dug through my collection of Rendezvous Medallions and found one for 1977 but no location that I can pin down. The one held in 1978 and, again, it was held in the mountains west of Buffalo was the one that I was the Booshway for. The location was about two miles down the Billy Creek Road, just off the Hazelton Rd. in the Big Horns west of Buffalo. It was held on BLM land and I always thought it funny that they had to send a person from Laramie up to walk the site and make sure there were no Indian artifacts on it before we could use it. I am sure after the rendezvous was over there were lots of beads, and artifacts left there.

In 1974 I went to the National Blackpowder matches in Friendship, Indiana. I got acquainted with Maxine Moss and at the time she was the ramrod of the magazine Muzzle Blasts, in fact, she practically ran the whole organization. She was concerned about the clubs that were operating under the NMLRA charter and were, in fact, just liquor outlets. I went back in 1975 and she asked me if I would be the Field Rep. for Wyoming and try and get the skinny on two or three of those clubs in Wyoming. I agreed and started with the Cozy Club in Casper. Their charter got pulled real quick. Then I went to Douglas and visited with the County Attorney and he took me to see one up in the mountains west of Douglas. It was called The Esterbrook Lodge. Same thing happened there. They lost their charter.

I don't remember how long I served as Field Rep. but a few years later Jim White took over. Possibly later on Travis Bennett took over. During those



years of the late 70's there was much talk about organizing the muzzle loading clubs around the state. I have included copies of two newspaper articles concerning that. My wife dug those out of her files. She says I had all my membership cards (someplace) but, they haven't been located yet. Representatives from some of the clubs around the state met in Casper around the middle of Jan. 1978. We met at the home of Richard Sapp. Myself, Red Roberts, and Dan Epperson represented Buffalo's club. I have always thought it odd that Dan Epperson was never listed on the front of the newsletter. He was about as avid a muzzle loader as there was in the whole state and, I know for a fact that he was at the start up meeting. Anyway, the Newspaper articles that I have enclosed will give the three of us who were elected to office.

I also remember Travis Bennett, Jim White, John Boesch, Richard Sapp, Dave Wheeler, Fred Coates. I am surprised that Fred Coates son-in-law, John Brooker, isn't listed. But, maybe he wasn't there that day. I do not remember Artie Joss, Mark Warns, and Dave Spethman. Not to say they were not there, I just don't remember them. I did know them and shot with all of them many times.

This has put quite a strain on my Way-Back-Machine but it has been enjoyable to try and remember all this stuff and to dig out all my old newsletters, newspaper items, and medallions from the past. One other thing, I wrote a monthly column for Muzzle Blasts and one for Buckskin Report. I think I started writing in 1975 or 76 and continued till about 1980 or 81. The one in Muzzle Blasts was all about the Primitive aspect of muzzle loading. In fact, I think the column was called "On The Primitive Scene." Those articles could have had more information on the WSMLA. I just gave all my old Muzzle Blasts away last winter or I would look the articles up.

## Muzzleloaders Unite In State Group

Representatives from the Wyoming muzzle loading clubs and other interested shooters held a meeting in

Casper, Wyo. on January 21, 1978 for an all out attempt at uniting the black powder sportsmen of the state.

In past years the muzzle loading clubs around the state have scheduled matches for the shooting season only to discover other clubs had picked the same weekend. Attendance was down at all the shoots, so it was decided that a joint effort was in order.

Officers and members of the clubs met in Casper, because of it's central location, and set about the task of scheduling an entire year of muzzle loading events for the state. The first order of business was the forming of a new organization, to be known as THE WYOMING STATE MUZZLE LOADING ASSOCIATION. The first officers of the newly formed organization are Bill Jennings of Buffalo - President, Travis Bennett of Riverton - Vice President, and Donald J. McCandlish of Laramie - Sec.-Tres.

The W.S.M.L.A. recognized eleven major muzzle loading matches and events

around the state for the 1978 season, and proceeded to make up a calendar of events, which will be sent to all clubs, members, and interested persons. The high light of the 1978 season will be the first two day shooting event designated as a Wyoming State Match.

The match will be July 15 & 16. The location is being chosen by a committee at this time, and it is fairly certain to be held in the vicinity of Casper.

An appointed committee is presently designing membership cards which will be issued as soon as possible. Dues for the Wyoming State Muzzle Loading Association are \$2.00 per year and will be required to participate in the Associations activities. Membership cards will be issued on a "first-come-basis" and will be numbered accordingly. Anyone wishing to join the State Association is asked to send two dollars along with their name and address to Donald J. McCandlish, 164 N. 3rd., Laramie, Wyoming 82070.

## Bill Jennings Heads State Muzzle Loading Association

Bill Jennings of Buffalo was elected president of the Wyoming State Muzzle Loading Association which was organized Jan. 21 in Casper.

Jennings, along with Travis Bennett of Riverton, vice president, and Donald J. McCandlish of Laramie, secretary-treasurer, will serve one-year terms.

Muzzle loading enthusiasts attending the meeting included representatives from Buffalo, Casper, Riverton, Shoshoni, Laramie and Keeline. The primary objectives of the new organization will be to assemble information regarding all muzzle-loading activities in the state and make a calendar of events which will, in turn, be sent to all members and other interested parties within the state and elsewhere.

Jennings said it is hoped the Association will also serve as an inspiration to all muzzle loaders and form a closer bond of friendship among those interested in the sport.

The Wyoming State

Muzzle Loading Assn., will hold annual membership meetings in Casper on the second Saturday of each January. Individual dues were established at \$2.00 per year with membership cards to be issued by the secretary-treasurer.

These cards will carry a membership number beginning with number one, and the number issued to a member will be his for life or as long as he

continues to pay dues. Anyone interested in joining should send his dues, along with his name and address, to Donald J. McCandlish, 164 N. 3rd, Laramie 82070.

The first official act of the Association was to schedule Wyoming's first state-wide muzzle loading shoot for July 15-16. Exact location will be decided at a later date, but Jennings said it will probably be in the Casper area.
