Rockford Model T Club Board/General Meeting Minutes, March 1, 2023

Club president Aaron Crandall welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at United Lutheran Church, Rockford. Officers, Board and club members present included: Aaron Crandall, Jay Larson, Deb Werner, Duane Bunton, Dave Lantz, Bill Werner, Craig Sheridan, Wayne and Phyllis Orrison, Joe Maurer, Scott and Sheryl Stier, and Steve Kindell via telephone.

Guests: Alan Pedersen, friend of Joe Maurer (and tour assistant) and a member of the Model A Club, attended the meeting and to assist Joe concerning the upcoming Overnight Tour event.

Secretary Deb Werner read the minutes of the December 2022 meeting. Wayne Orrison moved to approve, seconded by Craig Sheridan.

Jay Larson read the treasurer's report. Jay provided a copy of the treasurer's report to each member and provided an overview, including a list of the club member dues paid and a list of the charities the club donated to in December 2021. Dave Lantz moved to approve, seconded by Craig Sheridan; approved.

Old Business: Discussion took place regarding donations of the charities the club donates to each year. Joe Maurer suggested raising the donation amount to \$125 per charity, due to inflation and rising costs for the charities. Duane Bunton suggested waiting until next year to discuss raising the donation amount. Sheryl Stier suggested adding a donation to the Piquette Plant to the club's list of charities. Craig Sheridan suggested waiting to donate to the charities until after the Little Hershey 2023 event. New Business: Sheryl Stier informed club members of the upcoming annual club banquet, scheduled for April 23. Sheryl states after calling numerous local restaurants, Thunder Bay Restaurant provided the best deal. Club members decided on the brunch buffet at 11:30 a.m. Club members will be celebrating Helen Anglemire's 100th birthday at the banquet. Sheryl also suggested selling raffle tickets for a give-away gift (something from club member's home, such as a car-related item) but no "white elephant" gifts. Dave said he will be contacting possible food vendors this week. Dave said the bids are approximately the same cost as 3-D Sound and states Kurt Duesterhoeft is working on a set-up for announcements (instead of using a DJ service). Wayne Orrison states he will contact the golf carts person. Dave stated Little Hershey set-up is scheduled for Thursday, May 18.

Past Club Events: Joe Maurer discussed the 2022 Overnight Tour and stated it was a lot of fun and a big success as attendees enjoyed a good time during the tour. Joe and club members decided the Overnight Tour dates for 2023 are Sept. 26 to 27. Joe states meet at Pecatonica Park and states the tour will head northwest into the hills.



Rockford's Model T Connection – Part IV

In this series we've been looking at the contributions Rockford made to the Model T industry. So far we've looked at companies that supplied aftermarket parts such as auxiliary transmissions, shock absorbers, spark plugs, and timers. Now we'll start looking at OEM parts that were supplied directly to Ford.

Rockford Drop Forge provided components to a number of auto manufacturers, including Peerless, Dart, Cleveland, and Pierce Arrow, according to a local newspaper clipping from March of 1962. They also supplied Ford with Model T crankshafts. Given the sheer volume of cars Ford was producing, it seems likely that Drop Forge was probably one of many crankshaft suppliers. But that Model T in your garage may just have a crankshaft that was forged right here in Rockford. The company is still in business today and continues to occupy the factory at 2011 10th Street.



THE ROCKFORD DROP FORGE COMPANY

The Rockford Drop Forge Company was incorporated in 1911. Their principle business is making drop forging for automobiles.

In this undated photo, it appears the building may be under construction and nearing completion.



Today, the brick and glass have been covered by a metal exterior, but the building's original shape is clearly visible. Note: The lightpole in the photographs appears to be in nearly the same spot. Some things don't change!
