CHAPTER HISTORY

In 1964, the eight founders of Top Ladies of Distinction, (TLOD) Inc.'s primary objective was to help alleviate the moral and social problems engulfing the youth in our communities. This was done via a youth organization. In 1968, while meeting in Fort Worth, Texas, the membership of Top Ladies of Distinction, Inc. decided that the group should have an official name. Lady Cordelia Mackey, President of the Texarkana Twin City Chapter, suggested the name of Top Teens of America. The name was adopted.

On August 30, 2009 the Prince George's County Chapter of Top Ladies of Distinction, Inc., organized by Lady Jacqueline Wilcher, was chartered. On the same day, seventeen (17) youth consisting of fourteen (14) young women and three (3) young men, were inducted into the Top Teens of America Program. These Chartering and Induction Ceremonies marked the official beginning of the Prince George's County Chapter of Top Teens of America.

Since that time, 60 more Teens have been inducted into the program; volunteering more over 1,000 service hours to the Prince George's County Community. Graduates have received over \$12,500 in National, Area, and Chapter levels scholarships.
