Cemetery Millage Renewal Proposal

Shall the previously voted increase in the tax rate limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on general ad valorem taxes in Everett Township of 0.25 mills (\$0.25 per \$1,000 of taxable value), as reduced to 0.2270 mills (\$0.2270 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollback, be renewed at 0.2270 mills (\$0.2270 per \$1,000), and shall Everett Township levy such millage annually for four (4) years, 2024 through 2027, inclusive, for the purpose of operating the Big Prairie Everett Cemetery?

If approved and levied, this millage would raise an estimated \$15,302 in the first year of the levy. All of the revenues will be disbursed to the Big Prairie Everett Cemetery.

Fire Protection Millage Renewal Proposal

Shall the previously voted increase in the tax rate limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on general ad valorem taxes in Everett Township of 1.5 mills (\$1.50 per \$1,000 of taxable value), as reduced to 1.3629 mills (\$1.3629 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollback, be renewed at 1.3629 mills (\$1.3629 per \$1,000), and shall Everett Township levy such millage annually for four (4) years, 2024 through 2027, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds to purchase fire extinguishing apparatus and equipment and for the maintenance and operation of fire protection within the Township?

If approved and levied, this millage would raise an estimated \$91,862 in the first year of the levy. All of the millage funds will be disbursed to the White Cloud Area Fire Department.

Road Millage Renewal Proposal

Shall the previously voted increase in the tax rate limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on general ad valorem taxes in Everett Township of 3.0 mills (\$3.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value), as reduced to 2.7255 mills (\$2.7255 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollback, be renewed at 2.7255 mills (\$2.7255 per \$1,000), and shall Everett Township levy such millage annually for four (4) years, 2024 through 2027, inclusive, for the purpose of improving and repairing roads within the Township?

If approved and levied, this millage would raise an estimated \$183,730 in the first year of the levy. All or part of the revenues from this millage may be disbursed to the Newaygo County Road Commission.

Bond Proposal

Shall White Cloud Public Schools, Newaygo County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Twenty-Eight Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$28,400,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for the purpose of:

erecting, completing, remodeling, and equipping and re-equipping school buildings and facilities, and additions to school buildings and facilities; furnishing and refurbishing school buildings and facilities; acquiring, installing, equipping and re-equipping school buildings for instructional technology; and preparing, developing, improving and equipping athletic fields, play fields, playgrounds, structures, facilities and sites?

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2024, under current law, is 0 mill (\$0.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a 0 mill net increase over the prior year's levy. The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is thirty (30) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 4.22 mills (\$4.22 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district expects to borrow from the State School Bond Qualification and Loan Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated total principal amount of that borrowing is \$6,868,143 and the estimated total interest to be paid thereon is \$3,060,541. The estimated duration of the millage levy associated with that borrowing is 12 years and the estimated computed millage rate for such levy is 9.5 mills. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$15,190,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is approximately \$615,074.
