



What is the AmericaServes Network?

AmericaServes is a coordinated network of services, resources, and care, that provides direct access for veterans, service members, and their families

In each local AmericaServes Network, Providers within a region work together to identify the services their Network would offer and the geographic area it would cover

By joining the Network, Providers are able to refer Clients they are unable to serve to the care they need, without taking on the time burden associated with linking to another Provider and following up with the Client – the Coordination Center performs these functions

The local Coordination Center (human element supporting the Network) coordinates referrals, and the technology platform records updates and data in a secure way, allowing Providers to refer Clients for more than one service, and track referral progress when convenient for them

How Does the Network Work?



Access: Veteran, service member or family accesses the Network requesting services. Client can access the Network either through the Network's website, through a Network Providers, or by contacting the Coordination Center directly



Intake: The Provider or Coordination Center performs an intake to understand the Client's needs, then creates a referral and distributes it through the Network's technology platform



Referral: The referral is sent to a Provider that can meet the Client's needs and eligibility restrictions. The Provider either accepts or rejects the referral, and the process is repeated until a positive match is made



Service: Once a positive match is made, the Client is notified and is connected with the Provider to receive the services they need. Service updates and notes are recorded on the Network's platform for easier tracking and data collection. Once the Client's needs are fulfilled, the referral is closed
