# Chapter 32

# They're Gonna Crucify Me

# BIBLE

Great fear came on the whole assembly, and on all who heard these things.<sup>1</sup>

John testified, saying, "I have seen the Spirit descending like a dove out of heaven, and it remained on him.<sup>2</sup> He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the assemblies.<sup>3</sup>

"For first of all, when you come together in the assembly, I hear that divisions exist among you, and I partly believe it.<sup>4</sup> If anyone among you thinks himself to be religious while he doesn't bridle his tongue, but deceives his heart, this man's religion is worthless.<sup>5</sup>

"Pure religion and undefiled before our God and Father is this: to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.<sup>6</sup>

"Now, you priests, this commandment is for you.<sup>7</sup>

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you devour widows' houses, and as a pretense you make long prayers. Therefore you will receive greater condemnation."<sup>8</sup>

# COMMENTARY

Acts 5:11[*The "assembly" is the church*] In the Sixties, organized religion was in decline. The traditional, historical Christian doctrine was being questioned, and people were beginning to explore alternative spiritual ideas and practices. Church leaders felt threatened by the influence that rock and roll and the Beatles were having on young people.

He said to them, "Full well do you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep your tradition.<sup>9</sup> For I desire mercy, and not sacrifice; and the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings.<sup>10</sup>

"You have devised shame to your house, by cutting off many peoples, and have sinned against your soul,<sup>11</sup> making void the word of God by your tradition, which you have handed down. You do many things like this."<sup>12</sup>

He said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath.<sup>13</sup> The God who made the world and all things in it, he, being Lord of heaven and earth, doesn't dwell in temples made with hands.<sup>14</sup>

"Every priest indeed stands day by day serving and often offering the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins.<sup>15</sup> I hate, I despise your feasts, and I can't stand your solemn assemblies."<sup>16</sup>

He said to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer,' but you have made it a den of robbers! <sup>17</sup> You blind Pharisee, first clean the inside of the cup and of the platter, that its outside may become clean also."<sup>18</sup>

He said to them, "Are you thus without understanding also? Don't you perceive that whatever goes into the man from outside can't defile him?<sup>19</sup> Don't you know that you are a temple of God, and that God's Spirit lives in you?<sup>20</sup>

"You foolish ones, didn't he who made the outside make the inside also?<sup>21</sup> A fool has no delight in understanding, but only in revealing his own opinion,<sup>22</sup> always learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth.<sup>23</sup>

"For from the least of them even to the greatest of them, everyone is given to covetousness; and from the prophet even to the priest, everyone deals falsely.<sup>24</sup>

"They profess that they know God, but by their works they deny him, being abominable, disobedient, and unfit for any good work.<sup>25</sup> They have mouths, but they can't speak. They have eyes, but they can't see."<sup>26</sup>

This is John's testimony, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?"<sup>27</sup>

He said to them, "I am a Hebrew, and I fear Yahweh, the God of heaven, who has made the sea and the dry land.<sup>28</sup> I know him, because I am from him, and he sent me.<sup>29</sup>

"You have not known him, but I know him. If I said, 'I don't know him,' I would be like you, a liar. But I know him, and keep his word.<sup>30</sup> While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."<sup>31</sup>

They were all filled with wrath in the synagogue as they heard these things,<sup>32</sup> and said "Full of all deceit and all cunning, you son of the devil, you enemy of all righteousness, will you not cease to pervert the right ways of the Lord?"<sup>33</sup>

Likewise, also the chief priests mocking among themselves with the scribes said, "He saved others. He can't save himself.<sup>34</sup> For many deceivers have gone out into the world, those who don't confess that Jesus Christ came in the flesh. This is the deceiver and the Antichrist.<sup>35</sup>

"For the word of the cross is foolishness to those who are dying, but to us who are saved it is the power of God.<sup>36</sup>

- <sup>36</sup> 1 Corinthians 1:18 The "word of the cross" refers to the doctrine of substitutionary atonement: Jesus died for our sins. According to this doctrine, God sacrificed his only Son to atone for the sins of mankind. Since no sacrifice that man could provide was good enough to satisfy Divine justice, a perfect sacrifice was needed to save us from damnation. Thus, God became flesh, and Jesus died on our behalf, as our substitute.

The historical Christian faith dictates that if we believe that Jesus died for our sins and accept him as our personal savior, we will go to Heaven. But if we do not believe this, we will go to Hell. This seems harsh, and certainly, God does not want anyone to suffer eternal punishment, but His law is perfect and just, and since all of us are guilty, a price must be paid. We certainly cannot enter God's Heaven based on our own good works. Jesus has paid our penalty for us, and it is our choice to accept or reject this free gift.

"For Jews ask for signs, Greeks seek after wisdom,<sup>37</sup> but we preach Christ crucified; a stumbling block to Jews, and foolishness to Greeks.<sup>38</sup>

"For while we were yet weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.<sup>39</sup> And he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only, but for the whole world.<sup>40</sup>

"He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who disbelieves will be condemned.<sup>41</sup> And there isn't another 'good news.' Only there are some who trouble you, and want to pervert the Good News of Christ.<sup>42</sup>

Animals were routinely slaughtered and their blood was smeared upon the sacrificial altar. The sacrifice of Jesus, the "lamb of God", helped to end this primitive practice. The idea of substitutionary atonement made sense to the people living in that era, and helped to grow the new religion, setting Christianity apart from other faiths. Jesus became more than just another good moral teacher. Salvation was now possible simply by taking on a new belief system, and this was definitely a step in the right direction. Without the doctrine of substitutionary atonement, the teachings of Jesus, and Christianity itself, may not have survived.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life.<sup>43</sup>

"For him who knew no sin he made to be sin on our behalf; so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.<sup>44</sup> One who believes in the Son has eternal life, but one who disobeys the Son won't see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.<sup>45</sup>

"There is salvation in none other, for neither is there any other name under heaven, that is given among men, by which we must be saved!<sup>46</sup> For God didn't appoint us to wrath, but to the obtaining of salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.<sup>47</sup>

"As Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside, and on the way he said to them,<sup>48</sup> 'Where I go, you know, and you know the way."<sup>49</sup> Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we don't know where you are going. How can we know the way?"<sup>50</sup>

"Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father, except through me.""<sup>51</sup>

As John was fulfilling his course, he said, "What do you suppose that I am? I am not he. But behold, one comes after me the sandals of whose feet I am not worthy to untie.<sup>52</sup>

"For you know what instructions we gave you through the Lord Jesus.<sup>53</sup> In this love has been made perfect among us, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment, because as he is, even so are we in this world."<sup>54</sup>

He said to them, "You are from beneath. I am from above. You are of this world. I am not of this world.<sup>55</sup> You will seek me, and won't find me; and where I am, you can't come.<sup>56</sup>

- 51 John 14:6 Jesus is speaking here as the fully anointed Christ, or the "I am" presence. The only way to reach "the Father," or our own innate spiritual identity, is through the Christ, the mind of God that is individualized in each one of us. The Christ is the way, the truth, and the life. "I am" is the way, "I am" is the truth, "I am" is the life. This verse is similar to a passage in the Bhagavad Gita, where Lord Krishna tells his followers "I am the way, come to Me." Christ and Krishna are derived from the Greek word Christos, which means "the anointed one." Interestingly, Jesus and Krishna are both said to have been born of a virgin.

"Oh that you would be completely silent! Then you would be wise.<sup>57</sup> In that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you."<sup>58</sup>

Then the high priest tore his clothing, saying, "He has spoken blasphemy! Why do we need any more witnesses? Behold, now you have heard his blasphemy."<sup>59</sup>

As soon as it was day, the assembly of the elders of the people was gathered together, both chief priests and scribes, and they led him away into their council, saying,<sup>60</sup> "Your memorable sayings are proverbs of ashes, Your defenses are defenses of clay."<sup>61</sup>

They spoke many other things against him, insulting him<sup>62</sup>saying "this man persuades men to worship God contrary to the law. <sup>63</sup> Now I beg you, brothers, look out for those who are causing the divisions and occasions of stumbling, contrary to the doctrine which you learned, and turn away from them."<sup>64</sup>

They said one to another, "Behold, this dreamer comes.<sup>65</sup> For those who are such don't serve our Lord, Jesus Christ, but their own belly; and by their smooth and flattering speech, they deceive the hearts of the innocent."<sup>66</sup>

Some stood up, and gave false testimony against him, saying,<sup>67</sup> "Behold, you are to them as a very lovely song of one who has a pleasant voice, and can play well on an instrument; for they hear your words, but they don't do them.<sup>68</sup>

"They come to you as the people come, and they sit before you as my people, and they hear your words, but don't do them; for with their mouth they show much love, but their heart goes after their gain.<sup>69</sup>

"Those who see you will stare at you. They will ponder you, saying 'Is this the man who made the earth to tremble, who shook kingdoms?""<sup>70</sup>

Then spoke the priests and the prophets to the princes and to all the people, saying, "This man is worthy of death; for he has prophesied against this city, as you have heard with your ears.<sup>71</sup>

"Who put him in charge of the earth? or who has appointed him over the whole world?"<sup>72</sup>

The chief priests and the scribes stood, vehemently accusing him.<sup>73</sup> They cried out again, "Crucify him!" <sup>74</sup>

When he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he answered nothing.<sup>75</sup> For he received from God the Father honor and glory, when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.<sup>76</sup> Don't touch my anointed ones! Do my prophets no harm!"<sup>77</sup>
