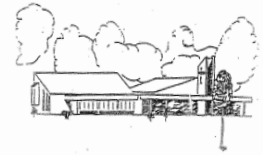

This month, parochial schools of all faiths join together in celebrating *National School Choice Week* from January 26-February 1. Families in Iowa are truly blessed to benefit from the state paying a portion of the tuition costs for children to attend a Lutheran school. This past year any family with income 400% above the poverty level could receive assistance. That means that a family of 4 could earn \$103,000 and still qualify! Some families attending St. Paul’s only pay **\$800 for the year** in tuition due to the program.

It is not too early to start thinking about where your kindergarten student will begin their formal education. Let your choice be at the feet of Jesus. We prepare students not only for this life but for **eternity**.
