he has chosen you.

As I am writing this, I find myself remembering all that we experienced while we were in Kenya recently. More than anything, I am aware that we are all children of God. It does not matter that we are different in our skin or hair or our interests. What does matter is that we treat each person as a child of God.

November brings us All Saints'
Day, World Community Day,
and the end of Daylight savings time. There are also
Veterans Day, Hunger and
Homeless Sunday, Matthew 25: Eradicating Systemic Poverty Sunday,
Thanksgiving Day, and the
1st Sunday of Advent. During
November, we spend much time
preparing for Advent.

Take a moment to read through the items that are part of November. Do all of those items resonate with you? Are you familiar with the different days? Here are four items that remind us of our Christian perspectives.

1) All Saints Day is also known as All Hollow's Day. It is a Christian celebration in honor of all the saints from Christian History.

2) World Community Day began in 1943. It was created for church women across the denominations to study peace. After WWII, leaders of denominations set aside this day for prayer and ecumenical study.

3) Hunger and Homeless Sunday has been part of the Presbyterian Planning Calendar for a long time. For those of us following the call to feed and welcome the hungry the stranger, Hunger and Homelessness Sunday is vital. You may want to share a Minute for Mission on what your church is doing. This is a good time to remember that food insecurity is a real problem in our country, taking time to pause and prepare ourselves and focus on what we believe people should have access to in our world.

4) The fourth item begins with the first Sunday of Advent in 2022. Many of us have had a chaotic year. This is the time to pause, read, pray, and reflect over the course of the Advent season. The first Sunday gives us the opportunity to center our thoughts on HOPE. Galatians 4:4-8 says: "When the right time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, subject

to the law. God sent him to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law, so that he could adopt us as his very own children. Because we are his children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, prompting us to call out, "Abba, Father."

Now you are no longer a slave but God's own child. Since you are his child, God has made you, his heir."

As we ponder our thoughts during November and beyond, take time to prepare your hearts to celebrate Jesus' arrival. May our hearts and homes be filled with HOPE.




