

MCAG's March "Artist of the Month" is Tane' Miller

Tané (pronounced Ten-ay) is a visual artist who uses impressionism, realism, and vibrant color to portray the splendor of nature in landscapes, and the simplicity of life in figures, from her work around the world. Her landscape paintings reflect a love of nature from views of rivers and woods, to majestic mountains and desert scenes, with a desire to capture the mood and light of the moment. For 22 years Tané has served in missions and music ministry traveling full time working in 17 countries. They include much of Europe, the British Isles, Africa, the Caribbean, Mexico, and the Arctic of Canada to the Inuit Eskimo, where the average Temperature is -60 below zero.



She is continually inspired by the beautiful people, cultures, and landscapes that she strives to capture in photos and sketches for her studio paintings. Growing up in West Texas, Tané showed an unusual love for drawing and art as a young child that continues to this day. Many of her weekends growing up were spent camping with her family in the national parks of New Mexico, Arizona, and Colorado, and was often seen sketching trees and plants. She has always been inspired by the mountains, sunsets, and wide open spaces of the South West.

Tané studied classical voice and opera in college and was primarily self taught in art. Though she has continued to paint and draw along with her travels, she is now able to spend more quality time for her studio painting. She has been influenced by many great artists, both past and present, but her faith in the Lord has been her greatest influence and teacher as she strives to reflect on canvas the beauty of Creation. Tané currently resides in Marshall County. Tane' is a member of the Arts Council of Williamson County and the Marshall County Art Guild.
