

The National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Incorporated is a professional organization of teachers dedicated to the task of training youth of America to cope satisfactorily and effectively with today's problems, firmly believes education to be a potent factor in maintaining and perpetuating democracy as the most ideal form of life. Through day by day instruction in the classroom and multiple contacts in the community, the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Incorporated seeks to inform all citizens of the ever-changing problems of our culture and to equip them with the necessary social skills to solve these problems according to true democratic process.

The National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Incorporated Eta Chapter was chartered on March 5, 1927. This event took place at the Catherine YMCA of Philadelphia, PA. Sisters from Alpha and Beta Chapters were responsible for Eta's chartering. Nine ladies represented Eta's Charter members and we have two Honorary Members. The Sorors of Eta Chapter are hardworking, dedicated women who love the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Incorporated. Many of these women have pledged their undying love and support for the group by becoming Life Members. We have fourteen Life Members. Eta Sorors have also served in leadership positions on both the National and Regional levels.


Eta Chapter has a rich and expansive history. We were responsible for organizing and presenting the first Youth Conference which was for our Xinos (young ladies). The last Regional Conference Eta hosted was in Cherry Hill, NJ. Eta also hosted the 2008 Eastern Regional Xinos and Kudos Conference. Thirty-five Chapters from Connecticut to North Carolina participated in both conferences. The Sorors of Eta Chapter recognize the importance of training our youth. Our Xinos and Kudos consist of young ladies and young men in grades 9-12. We are also proud to acknowledge the husbands, friends, and significant others who represent the Anthropos or the "Men In Our Lives."

Eta Chapter has presented numerous activities to fund our Scholarship Program. We have invited the community to these events: Fashion Shows, Scholarship Luncheons, Jazz Brunches, Philadanco 2 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, famous authors and actors, Intermezzo Choir Ministry of Philadelphia, PA, and sponsored theatre plays. Eta Chapter Sorors and the Youth group participate in many community activities such as the October "Making Strides Against Breast Cancer", Dreams of Tomorrow's Girls Summit, serving Thanksgiving dinners, cards for Veterans, donations to Food Bank of South Jersey, and visiting elderly citizens. Eta Chapter and its affiliates: HUB Parents and Anthropos make it possible for our Youth Group through workshops, to inspire the attainment of high ethical, educational, moral, spiritual and social standards in order to confront the future with civility, confidence, and competence.

Eta Chapter each year gives scholarships to high school students who plan to major in education at the college of their choice. Middle school achievement awards are given to a young lady and a young man who have shown an interest in pursuing a career in education. The middle school awards are given to students in schools where our Sorors are teaching. Eta also gives book awards to graduating members of our Youth Group: Xinos and Kudos. National gives two six thousand dollar scholarships annually to each of the five regions. High school seniors may obtain applications from their counselors in the guidance department.

The National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Incorporated, Eta Chapter is committed to the ideals set forth by our founders. We wish to continue their legacy by following the tenets of our purpose.
