High School Football Update

High School football is well underway with teams facing their third game of the shortened season. Following is a summary of the 2020 season for the local teams:

Two Harbors. The Agates evened their record at 1-1 with a 14-12 win over the Virginia Blue Devils. The Agates used a strong running game in the second half for the win. Coach Tom Nelson credits a half-time “gutcheck” and increased determination for the win. The Agates are a young team, but Coach Nelson is pleased with the progress of many of his younger players. The first game of the season saw the Agates drop a tight game to Pine City 19-14.

When asked about the merits of high school football, Coach Nelson said, “Life has evolved so that football is one of the last things that provides young people with an opportunity to struggle mightily, to test themselves emotionally and physically, to learn from disappointment and to overcome. Football is a game where a player is accountable to fellow team members and to each other. It is special.”

Grand Marais. Viking Coach Mike Prom has nine seniors, many of whom he stated have “waited in line” for their opportunity to start. Some have limited experience, but Coach Prom is proud of their progress since the season began. The Vikings lost a 12-0 game to Ely. Like many nine-man teams, the Vikings lack depth and three injured starters limited the team's effectiveness.

Coach Prom has told his team that in this unpredictable year, his players need to treat each practice and each game as if it is their last. In today's crazy world, it just may be. He summarized, “Football is a wonderful way to reach life skills. It is a privilege to play. To succeed in football, just as in life, a player needs to overcome adversity, obstacles, and disappointment. I believe that ex-football players learn skills that will help them become

Covid-19 Update

Lake County added 20 new cases of Covid-19 this week, for a total to date count of 105 positive cases. There have been no recent hospitalizations directly related to the coronavirus, and no deaths. There are 11 lab-confirmed total cases in Cook County.

At a recent presentation Greg Ruberg, CEO/president of Lake View Hospital and Clinic, was asked: “How do you get through to people who don't take Covid-19 seriously?”

Ruberg said that relentlessly handing out factual information without ceasing is the best course.

“We have a public health crisis in the country, and this is a wake-up call. We have to figure out what is to be done, not by health care or public health alone, but by everyone all together,” said Ruberg.

Ruberg says that community members are beginning to understand that health care capacity is reaching a critical mark, and that community effort can help.

“We are in a delicate balance right now, but if people get reckless, whether they get sick from Covid-19 or have an accident, there might not be a hospital bed available for them,” said Ruberg.

Saying that there are difficult days to come this winter, Ruberg is cautioning people to make safe plans for the upcoming holidays. Including modifying Thanksgiving gatherings that traditionally bring various households and travelers together.

The CDC says that travel increases the risk of virus transmission, and suggests low-risk Thanksgiving celebrations with a special meal just with household members, delivering special meals to high-risk individuals, and having a virtual dinner with loved ones.

“You need to be appropriately fearful and take appropriate steps, to pace yourself to get through this difficult and stressful time,” said Ruberg.

At Lake View this last week Ruberg made special trips around the clinic and hospital with an “Appreciation Cart” to pass out special treats to every employee.

“It's a nice boost for everyone to be able to focus on something positive, and we just want to show how much we appreciate all the hard work everyone here has done getting through our construction disruptions and weathering the pandemic to date,” said Ruberg.
