Celebrate & Circulate Christmas

"Don't just celebrate Christmas this year; circulate it!" Those are the words of O.S. Hawkins in his booklet: *The Christmas Code:* Daily Devotions Celebrating the Advent Season. 1

The angel Gabriel told Mary that she had been favored by God. She was blessed because her Son would be called the Son of God. She was to name Him, 'Jesus.'

In a dream, an angel told Joseph not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife. Her baby was of the Holy Spirit. Joseph was told that when she brings forth her Son, he was to name Him 'Jesus,' for He would save His people from their sins.

Because of a decree from Caesar Augustus that everyone should be registered in their hometown, Joseph and Mary left Nazareth and traveled to Bethlehem, because they were of the lineage of David.

While they were there, Mary brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room in the inn.

Out in the fields, shepherds were watching their flock by night. Behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them and told them not to fear. The angel brought good tidings of great joy for all people.

Born that day in the city of David was a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. The shepherds were given a sign. The Babe would be wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.

The shepherds hurried to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph and the Baby who was lying in a manger.

Now when they had seen Him, they made widely known the saying which was told them concerning this Child.

And all those who heard it marveled at those things which were told them by the shepherds.

But Mary kept all these things and pondered them in her heart.

Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them. (Luke 2:17-20)

God chose simple shepherds to hear the angel's news of good tidings of great joy and the angels' song of glory.

The shepherds celebrated by going to see the Savior and glorifying and praising God. They circulated the good news by making widely known what they heard and saw. These shepherds were the first to circulate the good news of Christ's coming.

The word "Christmas" is a shortened form of the words "Christ's mass." Mass is derived from a Latin word which means "to send." Thus, the root meaning of Christmas is "to send Christ" or "Christ is sent."

The story of the birth of Jesus, the Savior of the world, is good news to be celebrated and circulated. Celebrate & Circulate Christmas!
