About Military Women Across the Nation (1979-2015)

Three former WAVES met some 30 years ago to seek out other WAVES and assist them as they were transitioning from the military back into civilian life. From the tireless efforts of Jeannie Palermo (Dicks), Loda Mae Dobbins and Esther Govorchin, the WAVES National Corporation was founded.

In 1980 there were 3,000 names and addresses on file with 768 paid members from 47 states. The first WAVES National Convention was held in Sacramento, CA with over 250 attending. The theme was "Still Something Special." During that convention it was decided to issue a newsletter "White Caps" to be published six times a year in order to keep everyone informed of relevant events and issues as well as to remain connected to the organization.

In 1985 the IRS formally recognized WAVES National as a non-profit Veteran's Service Organization (VSO) under IRS Code 501(c) (19). From there the organization expanded across the nation and evolved from a social organization to service as a VSO. Eleven U.S. Navy Chief Petty Officers from the WWII and Korean eras were initiated in Philadelphia in 2004, and we chartered the first-ever all-active duty unit stationed onboard a Navy ship ... the "Relentless WAVES of the USS FORREST SHERMAN" Unit 154 in January 2006.

At the WAVES National convention held aboard the Royal Caribbean cruise ship ALLURE OF THE SEAS in August 2014, members voted to expand the membership to include women who have honorably served or are serving in all facets of the United States Military. The name was also changed to reflect the new demographic: MILITARY WOMEN ACROSS THE NATION.

On 20 June 2015, 40 military women from Tennessee, Georgia, and Alabama were the first to obtain formal charter under the Military Women Across the Nation as Unit #157, Tri-State Women Veterans.

We welcome aboard all military women!

In February 1945, the U.S. Army sent 855 black women from the Women's Army Corps (WACs) to England and France. They are known as the **6888**. This is their story.

Unsung Heroes is executive produced by Academy Award winning filmmaker Ron Howard. The powerful first-hand accounts of women who have lived the story. They include Admiral Michelle Howard and General Ann Dunwoody, the two highest ranking women in the history of the American military.

Pueblo Grande Museum Archaeological Park

Donated to the city in 1924. A museum was opened on the site in 1929. A visit today consists of a two-thirds of a mile interpretive trail which travels around the remains of the ballcourt and platform mound-constructed by the ancestral Sonoran Desert people, identified by archaeologists as the Hohokam culture.







Superstition Narrow Gauge Railroad. The Superstition Scenic Narrow Gauge Railroad's 36" gauge train consists of a Plymouth diesel pulling a passenger car and a caboose. A mile and a half of track circles the town, and the narrated journey lasts 20 minutes. The engineer tells of the history of Goldfield, the Superstition Mountains, and the desert southwest in general. The train departs every 35 minutes on a 20 minute journey.

Goldfield Ghost Town also has: Mine Tour, Mystery Shack, Lu Lu's Bordello, Eagle Eye Shooting Gallery, Gold Panning, a Variety of shops, and an Old Western Style Saloon.

Boating on Canyon Lake started in 1925 onboard the USS Geronimo. Today The Dolly Steamboat carries 142 passengers with a crew of three. 103 ft long with a beam of 20 feet and powered by twin 225 hp John Deere marine diesel engines.
