
For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; ...a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance...Ecclesiastes 3

This iconic passage of scripture comes frequently to my mind when I am looking at the change of seasons. And even though I no longer teach in either the public school system or the private University system, September always triggers memories of school and the different energies associated with this time. And, of course, there is also the business and energy of the harvest—but I am still counting on you folks to teach me more about that!

I have learned here that both of these seasons affect how people interact with one another and with the church. But there are other forces out there that shape our interactions as well: sports, music, drama, life events like births and weddings, divorce and death, illness and graduations! As we increasingly live in a world where our relationships are far-flung, we travel more. And as we travel, we are often away from the local church.

Much of the reading that I am doing in church leadership these days talk about how these forces—and changing attitudes toward institutions in general—are affecting our local churches. I am reminded over and over again that we are invited to engage with one another on a deep level as we live and grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. In changing times (and when aren't the times changing!) we are invited to find new ways to meet with one another, to support and encourage each other in the challenges we face living as Christians.

This past Sunday, we worshiped outside by Lake Helen. We worshiped together...we ate together...we played together. There was a different energy in our singing and our praying as we connected in new ways. We continue to explore other ways of gathering in small groups to nurture one another and to grow our faith. As the changing seasons encourage us to explore new endeavors, I invite you to look for new ways that you can help grow disciples for Jesus Christ. What can you offer to



others to share the amazing gift of God's love in your life?


