April Recipe: Bananas Foster

Again this year, Colonial Acres Phase V will be participating in the Canada geese nest destruction program coordinated by the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR).

The nest destruction program gives Phase V a permit to destroy Canada goose eggs and encourage the nesting birds to leave our ponds. According to the MDNR, this is the most effective method to control geese.

Jim Reuschlein, of Clearview Management, conducts the nest destruction activities according to the requirements of the permit. The geese seem to nest in the same places each year, and he knows where to look. He will be out on the days designated in the program. He is not allowed to take any eggs laid after the designated dates.


Please do not approach the geese, or the nests. Please remember this project, supported by the Board, benefits the entire Colonial Acres Phase V community.

Earth Day is Monday, April 22:

Spring began March 21, and although Mother Nature gave us a taste of spring, warmer weather is on its way. Earth Day is Monday, April 22, and if you can make one change for Earth Day this year, make it this: please don't put any plastic bags in your recycling bin. These bags clog the machinery at the recycling center, and increase the costs of recycling. Paper bags are a better choice if you like to place your newspapers and other items in a bag within the recycling bin. And if you are spring cleaning, please remember the first Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Day will be held on Saturday, April 7 from 9 am to 2 pm at the Wixom Department of Public Works, 2041 Charms Road in Wixom. Bring your aerosol cans, cleaning fluids, or anything labeled poison, toxic, flammable, ignitable or corrosive for proper disposal. More information on recycling and Household Hazardous Waste can be found at www. southlyonmi.org under "Department of Public Works" (DPW) or download the "Recycling Authority" mobile app for your smartphone. This year you can bring up to four boxes of documents for shredding to the Salem-South Lyon Community Library on Saturday, May 4 from 10 am – 2 pm.

Adding plants to your courtyard this spring? Consider native plants. They grow naturally in the region in which they evolved, and are hardy because they have adapted to the local conditions. Willow Greenhouse at 7839 Curtis Road, Northville (south of 6 Mile Road) has a section in their greenhouse devoted to native plants, including black-eyed Susan, milkweed, prickly pear and clematis. I'm sure other local nurseries also carry native plants; you just need to ask.

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Let's talk about **Fall Preventionn** for a minute! One out of Three adults over age 65 fall each year. Seniors are especially prone to falling due to slow reflexes, making it difficult to regain balance. Over the course of a lifetime everyone falls, so there's no shame if it haoppens, That said the effects of a fall can be more serious for seniors, so best we follow a few steps to ensure we minimize our risk:

-Maintain a regular exercise routine, that incorporates balance exercises.

-Prevent weak bones by consuming adequate Calcium, and Vitamin D.

-**Protect your vision** get your eyes checked yearly, and ensure you're using your correct prescription eyewear,

-Be aware of medications that have side effects that can affect balance. blood pressure pills, muscle relaxers, and mood enhancers can all cause drowsiness.

Make your home safe to reduce fall risk

-Avoid the dark: many falls happen in changing light conditions, so when going from a well lit room to a dark room, take the extra moment to turn the lights on, and consider carrying a flashlight when going for a walk at dusk, Keep a flashlight at your bedside, in case you have a late night nature call, or an Emergency comes up.

-Avoid making your own hazards: Keep clutter out of hallways, and especially the area at the top of the stairs. Consider taking up any rugs you may use, if you do choose to use rugs make sure to use non-slip mats underneath, be wary of loose carpeting. Wear good well fitting shoes, avoid flip flops, and other loose footwear

-Beware of Bathroom Dangers: Install grab bars, and Shower safety stickers to avoid falls, clean up any spilled water as it happens

Keep safety in mind when going out

-**Use a mobility aid**-If you feel unsteady on your feet a cane, or Walker might give you a little extra reassurance when you leave your home. If you feel like it helps, don't wait for your doctor to suggest it,

-Wear good shoes , when the weather looks bad: Get yourself a good pair of shoes, or boots with a rubber sole, and wear them when the forecast calls for rain or snow.

-Be Alert: Walk on carpeted areas of a public building when possible, Avoid wet tile floors, Pay attention to changes in elevation, are there inclines/steps that you could lose balance on.

-Rely on others: A lot of people are willing to help if you're struggling don't be too proud to accept assistance when it's offered.

-Know your limits: When something is too heavy, or bulky, (continued on next page) use a hand cart/rolling cart, or a backpack/shoulder bag.to assist

If you fall try to land safely

Falling on grass is usually better than falling on gravel or concrete, If you can adjust your body to catch yourself and land handsor grab a piece of furniture, that can mean the difference between a few bruises and a hip fracture. Falling backwards and landing on your butt is safer than falling straight down or sideways.

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
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
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
