



SCHOOL BOARD NEWS

These are the UNOFFICIAL DRAFT MINUTES SUBJECT TO CHANGE AND BOARD APPROVAL, 2-6-102,104 MCA of the Regular April 17, 2017 School Board meeting:

- Chairman Lane Drury called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Roll was taken and it was established that a quorum was present.
- Patrons and visitors were recognized.
- On motion by Don Hagan, seconded by Tim Tande, the minutes from the regular meeting on March 20, 2017 were approved unanimously as presented.
- The superintendent and principal's reports were discussed and are attached and made a part of these minutes by reference.
- On motion by Bill Rask, seconded by Jesse Cole, the March 15, 2017 through April 12, 2017 claims in the amount of \$143,446.53 were approved unanimously as presented.
- On motion by Don Hagan, seconded by Bill Rask, the Activities Report for March, 2017 was approved unanimously as presented.
- Tim Tande moved to allow Student Council to hold a Spring Carnival on Sunday, April 30, 2017, waiving the no Sunday activity rules in the Student Handbook. Don Hagan seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Don Hagan moved to add Cross County for the 2017-2018 school year with no funding from the Scobey School, except for payment to MHSA of \$500.00 to add boys and girls cross country, and contingent upon approval by MHSA to these terms, and all liability coverage.
 Jesse Cole seconded and motion with Don Hagan and Jesse Cole voting "Aye" and Lane Drury, Bill Rask and Tim Tande voting "Nay" motion failed.
- Don Hagan moved to vote for 8/8 team districts for the 2018-2019 basketball season. Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Logan Brower addressed the Board about changing the facility use fees for the school to help cover costs of upgrading equipment and general maintenance of the facility. More information will be presented at the next meeting.
- Jesse Cole moved to add Terry Farver as a Volunteer Track Coach for the 2017 track season. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Jesse Cole moved to approve Brad Solberg as an activity and substitute bus driver for the remainder of the 2017-2018 school year, provided he is fully licensed prior to driving. Don Hagan seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Bill Rask moved to approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Scobey School and the Scobey Education Association allowing Logan Browers' appointment to the Fish and Wildlife Commission. Jesse Cole seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Don Hagan moved to approve Kendra Kimball and Karla Leibrand for 2017 summer school. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Don Hagan moved to approve the second reading of the 1000 and 2000 Recommended Board Policies as presented. Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- No action on the 3000 and 4000 Recommended Board Policies.
- Don Hagan reported on the Transportation Committee meeting that was held on April 13, 2017 with recommendations to leave buses as they currently are.
- As this is the last regular monthly meeting for Trustees Lane Drury and Bill Rask, the Board thanked them for their many years of service and contributions they made to Scobey Schools.
- There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
