

**Bank Block- Franklin Savings and National Bank 387 Central St.**





The Franklin Savings Bank began on June 30<sup>th</sup>, 1869 in what was the Sanborn Store at the corner of East Bow and Central St. Construction began at its present location in the spring of 1886. The space was shared between the Franklin Savings Bank and the Franklin National Bank, and on the third floor, starting in 1887, the local Masons Lodge. The iconic pink granite facade was added on April 1, 1961, and replaced in 2024. In the fall of 1994, FSB acquired the former Franklin National Bank building (formerly First NH Bank), uniting the two structures into one cohesive space. FSB now has 8 branches throughout the state.
