Right click on emails you don't want and that will send them to Junk.

This fall Apple is changing their software so be sure to upgrade before then.

Last month I talked about choosing the correct laptop for our club members. This month the question I will try to answer is iPad or Mac? For a majority of our clubs members that fall into the "Basic" user category the iPad is a good choice. A "basic" user is a person that mainly uses a computer to consume content such as surfing the Internet, Send/Receive E-mail, use Facebook, Skype and play games.

The iPad is easy to use, lightweight, portable and inexpensive compared to a Mac computer. There are two iPad product lines to chose from: iPad and iPad Pro. The iPad comes in two screen sizes: 7.9 and 9.7 in. The iPad Pro comes in two screen sizes: 9.7 and 12.9. They all come Wi-Fi enabled. For \$130.00 more a cellular data option is also available.

For our basic user who wants a small screen, the iPad Mini 4 is the only choice (and a very good one) at \$399.00 it has Wi-Fi and 128GB of storage. For a larger screen the new iPad is a very good choice and at \$329.00 for a Wi-Fi, 32GB model it by far is the best iPad for the price. This is the Continued on page 5

model I would recommend for our basic users. If budget allows, spend the extra \$100.00 to upgrade to the 128GB model for more storage. If you plan of taking extensive trips with the iPad, ordering the Cellular option may be a good idea. For most people the Wi-Fi model is all you need.

An iPad with a keyboard can be a solution for our intermediate users that create a limited/moderate amount of content. For our intermediate user who wants a small screen, the iPad Mini 4 is the only choice at \$399.00. It has Wi-Fi and 128GB of storage. For a larger screen the new iPad is a very good choice and at \$429.00 for a Wi-Fi, 128 GB model it by far the best iPad for the price. For even a larger screen size the iPad Pro comes in at 12.9 inches. The 12.9 inch iPad Pro with Wi-Fi & 128GB storage come in at \$899.00.

The iPad Pro line allows for more options such as an Apple Pencil (\$99.00) and an Apple Smart Keyboard (\$169.99). Adding both options brings the total to \$1,167.00. At this price an entry level 12 inch MacBook or 13 inch MacBook Pro may be considered. The iPad Pro with the Apple Pencil is the only option that allows

the user to draw directly on the screen.

Making a decision comes down to going with what you know and are currently using. If you have been using an iPad and need a larger screen upgrading to the 12.9 inch, iPad Pro would be a good choice. If you have been using a Mac computer updating to a 12.9 inch, iPad Pro would involve learning a new operating system. A MacBook or MacBook Pro would be a good choice. If you were switching from a window computer, the iPad would be a good choice.

Good luck in your search for your new computer.
