Blast From the Past

To continue in last week's celebration of the dedication of our beautiful church, I am sharing with you part of a letter from Edmund J Hunter to the Bishop in Harrisburg, discussing the need for a church in Shippensburg. His daughter, Sister Leona Hunter, is the first woman in our parish to be called to the religious life. She is a member of the community entitled the Adorers of the Blood of Christ. In this letter, Edmund Hunter shares the frustration of the Catholics in Shippensburg who are struggling to practice their faith. It is this very letter that brings the Shippensburg Catholic community to the attention to the Diocese. This eventually resulted in the construction of our parish church. A copy of the letter is in Mary's Kitchen. If you would like the full transcription, please let me know, and I will be happy to share it with you.

"I, myself, find it very difficult since I can't afford to have my car repaired. I can only get to my Mass with my wife and two children (who should attend Sunday School) when someone loans me their auto. When I had my car running last year I always had students from the college here who were glad to get some way to attend their Mass. I get many requests from different people every week to take them along but I have to turn them down when I can't borrow a car. I think we are in a terrible mess (foreigners) by that I mean we are a forgotten people yet in a civilized territory...I am in a non-Catholic town as you may know and if I don't attend my church I am opening myself for all kinds of scandal. The other children even call for my son to go with them and then mine ask why we don't have to go to church like so & so. It has my wife & I worried and now when we need spiritual help it just seems to add to worries. I would be only too glad to get some practical suggestions from you as to how we can overcome our losing our religion entirely."

Divine Wisdom

Jesus often teaches people a lesson already found in the wisdom books of the Old Testament.

Compare the words of Jesus son of Sirach to the words of Jesus Christ in the Gospel reading for today:

My child, from your youth choose discipline; and when you have gray hair you will find wisdom. As though plowing and sowing, draw close to her; then wait for her bountiful crops.

For in cultivating her you will work but little, and soon you will eat her fruit.

She is rough ground to the fool!

The stupid cannot abide her.

She will be like a burdensome stone to them, and they will not delay in casting her aside.

For discipline is like her name, she is not accessible to many.

Listen, my child, and take my advice; do not refuse my counsel.

--Sirach 6:18-23—

Later in the book of Sirach Lady Wisdom (which is God's wisdom personified) says these words:

Come to me, all who desire me, and be filled with my fruits.

You will remember me as sweeter than honey, better to have than the honeycomb.

Those who eat of me will hunger still, those who drink of me will thirst for more.

Whoever obeys me will not be put to shame, and those who serve me will never go astray."

--Sirach 24:19-22—

Here Wisdom says that when we drink of her, we will thirst for more. Jesus, who is Wisdom Incarnate, satisfies the thirst. To the Samaritan woman at the well, Jesus says, "Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst (John 4:14)."

That is the difference between the Old and New Testaments.

- In the Old, we taste the goodness of the Lord's wisdom and want more.
- In the New, our desire for the Lord's wisdom is satisfied.

The most refreshing thing about God's wisdom, especially as revealed in Jesus Christ, is that it requires a little effort with great rewards. So often, it seems like we work hard with little return on our investment. But, with divine wisdom, you trust a little, walk with God a little, simply accept His ways a little, and His merciful love enters the scene and gives value, meaning, purpose and effectiveness to our labors.

Come aside to me, you untutored, and take up lodging in the house of instruction;

How long will you deprive yourself of wisdom's food, how long endure such bitter thirst?

I open my mouth and speak of her: gain wisdom for yourselves at no cost.

Take her yoke upon your neck; that your mind may receive her teaching. For she is close to those who seek her, and the one who is in earnest finds her.

See for yourselves! I have labored only a little, but have found much.

Acquire but a little instruction, and you will win silver and gold through her.

May your soul rejoice in God's mercy; do not be ashamed to give him praise. Work at your tasks in due season, and in his own time God will give you your reward

--Sirach 51:23-30--

If you re-read the Gospel reading from today (Matthew 11:25-30) you can see that Jesus is practically quoting the book of Sirach. His main point: in Him we can take our refuge.
