SATURDAY 24th September

9:30 — Park Opening: official opening of the community park by Cllr Lawrence Fisher and former Carlisle United player, Peter Murphy.

10:00—13:30 —Centenary Fair : Join us at the park and in the hall for a range of fun activities.

Take part in our play park time trial, the slow bicycle race, penalty shoot-out, foot golf, or just enjoy the bouncy castle.

There will also be an opportunity to take a short pony

Recipe:

- * 4 Eggs
 - * 225g/8oz Caster Sugar
 - * 225g/8oz self raising flour
 - * 2 tsp baking powder

- Mix, divide into 2 tins, bake at 180°/350F/Gas 4 for around 25 mins. Turn out, fill (with jam and cream?), decorate.
