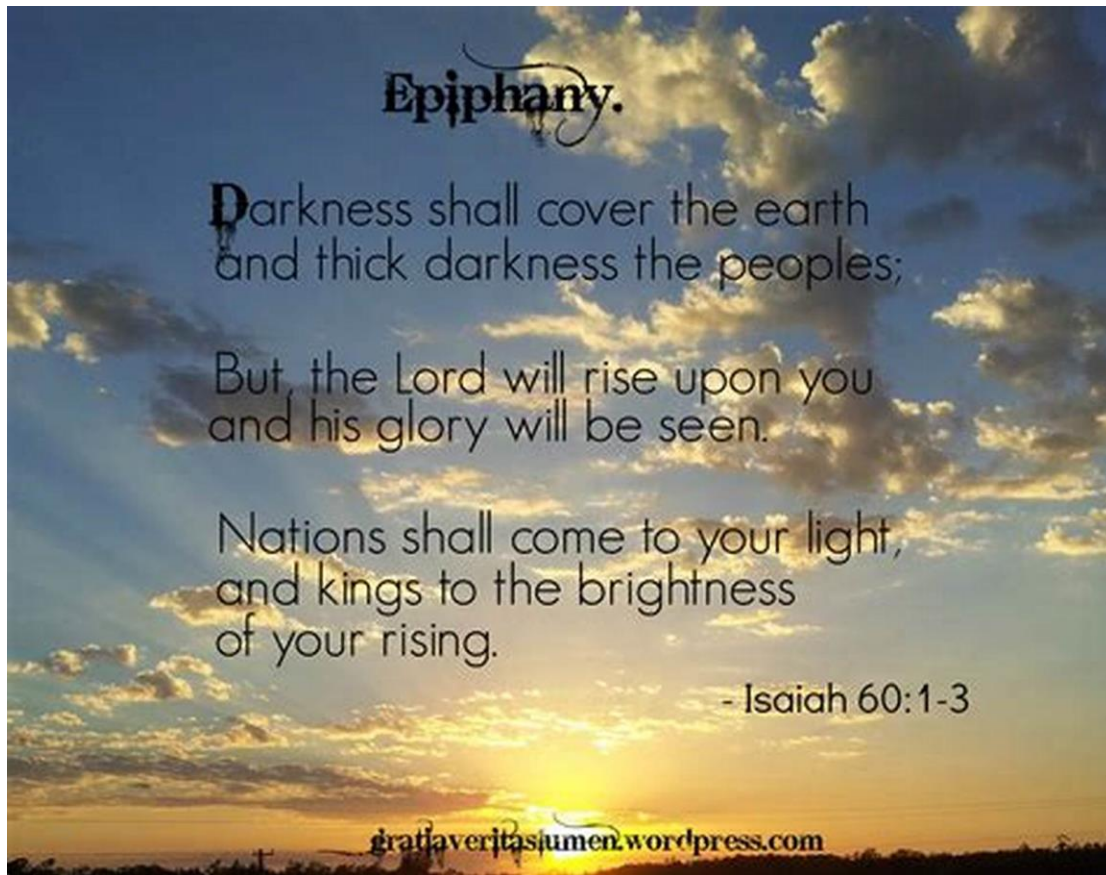

Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

First of all, I would like to say how truly honored I am to be able to serve all of you again in a new capacity as your council president. I assure you I will give this position the reverence and commitment it deserves. We are in the transition zone. We have been here longer than we planned and it is and has been uncomfortable. Unfortunately, our time in the transition zone has been costly. When we fail to navigate the transition zone well, church leaders become distressed, and social and relational breakdowns occur. This creates a growing climate of alienation and distrust, and even betrayal. These dynamics can result in losses of ministry and church vision, and outright division within the congregation. Basically, they prevent us from actively pursuing our mission. It might seem that our mission right now is to call a new pastor, but it's actually not. According to our mission statement (that is hanging above the doors to the sanctuary),

"We are a community of faith called to share the good news of Jesus as our model of life. We seek spiritual maturity through worship, learning and serving. We invite and welcome all who desire to share this journey of faith active in love."

As we continue going through the transition zone, we need to refuse to give up any sense of urgency for the mission of God to which our congregation has been called. The absence of pastoral leadership has no bearing on the need for passionate, thoughtful followers of Jesus who speak out against injustice, love unconditionally, and who serve with the conviction of Jesus himself. Our congregation is full of people willing and eager to serve. I may have been chosen to lead our church council, but I absolutely will not be able to do it without Carrie, Kay, Ed, Laura B., Pat, Dick, Tom M., Dana, and Don and that is the absolute truth. Dana and Lynne have been invaluable in supporting and training our new secretary Juli. Hank and Tom S., and Ted continue to keep the church grounds clean, and in good repair. The time, commitment, and gifts lavished on this church in the name of Christ literally takes my breath away. I would personally like to thank everyone who shares their talents from sewing, to cooking, to teaching, to making music, to managing money, to packing food, and mowing the lawn. You ALL matter and are integral to seeing us through this transition. I would like us to simply remember whose children we are and to be kind to each other. If you have questions or concerns, call me. Call a council member. All of our phone numbers are at the top of this newsletter. If we don't have the answer you need, we will find someone who does. Truth. We have the resources of the Synod as well as the pastoral guidance of Pastor Deb Taylor. Please, don't spread dissension! I'm going to try and make sure nothing falls through the cracks. I'll need everyone's help to do that. The apostle Peter reminds us that we have been given "everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness" (2 Pet. 1:3). I pray that with this promise, that when a new pastor comes to us, she or he will be able to keep up with all of us as we continue to be passionately engaged in bringing God's kingdom to our community—even while living in the transition zone!

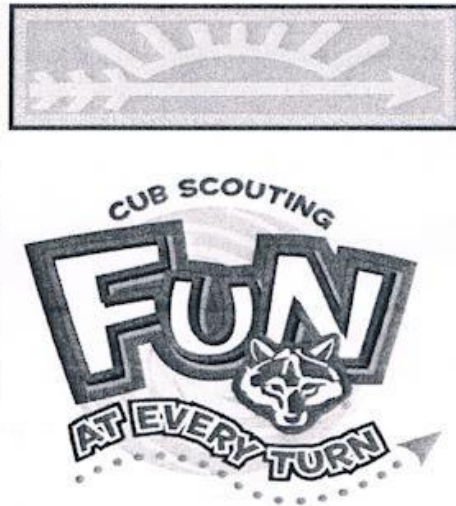

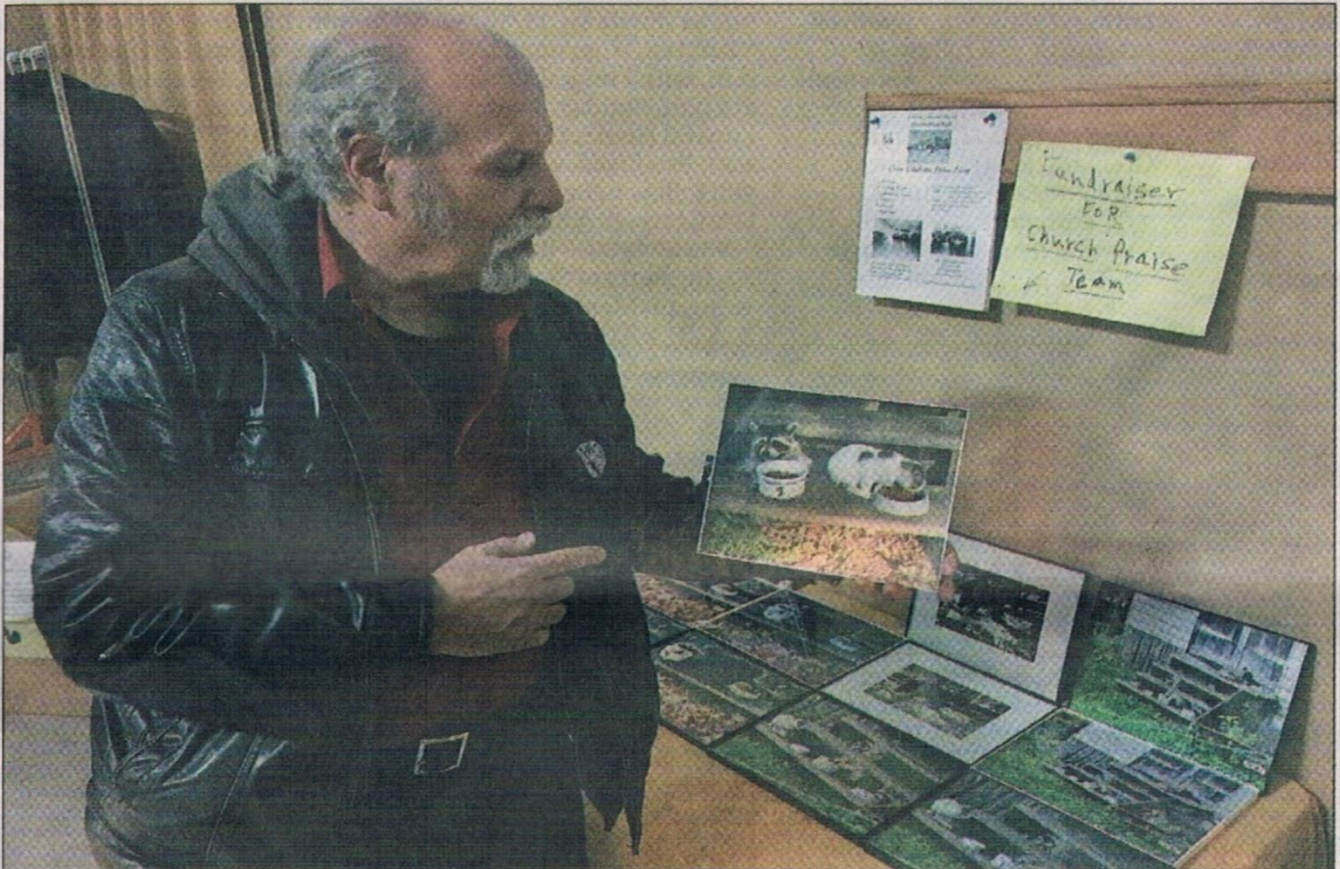
