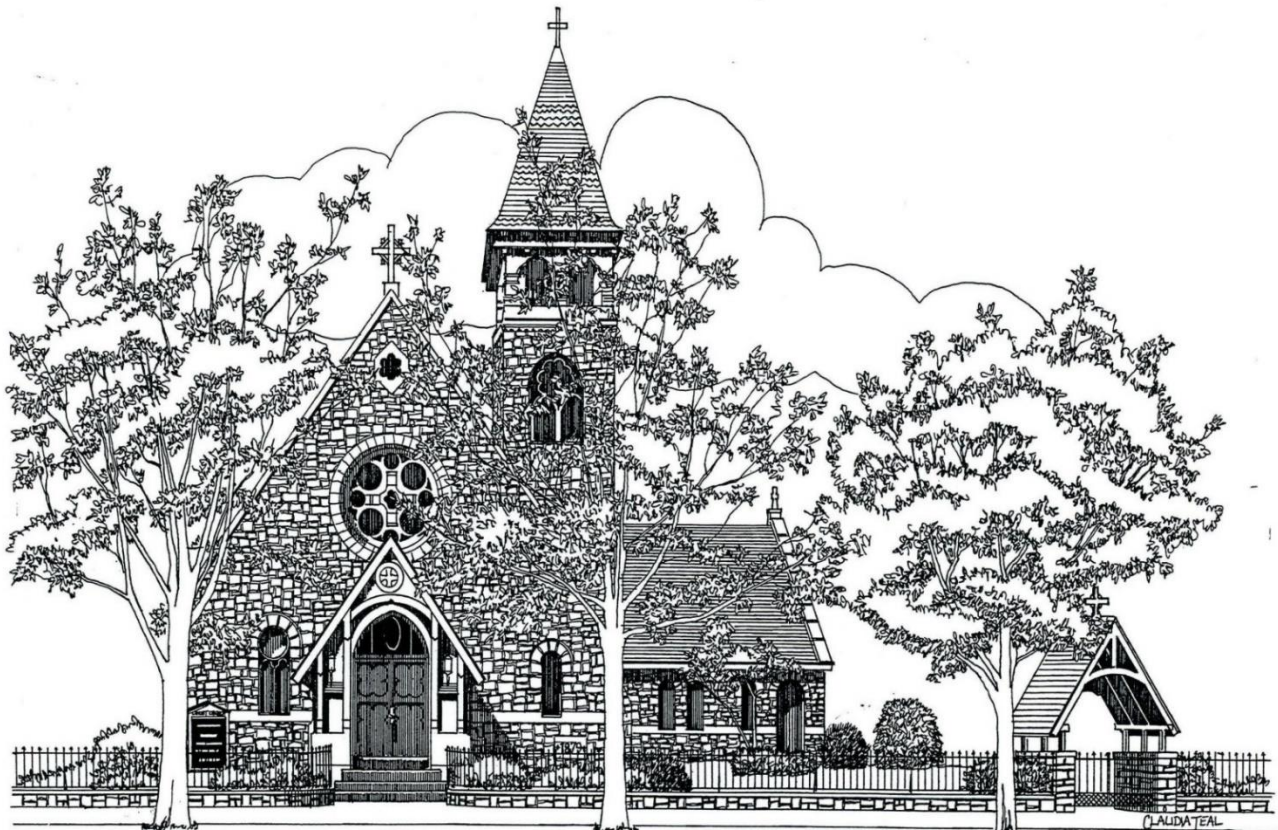

The windows in the Nave depict some of the fathers of the early Church, both English and Latin. The Rood shows our Savior, robed as a Priest, with the right hand in Blessing. The Chapel forms a quiet restful spot where, before the Blessed Sacrament, one may kneel in supplication and reverence. We are proud of our worshipful Church and invite you to share its benefit. Come in, rest, pray apart from the world. Surely God is in His Holy Temple.

All who confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, have been baptized in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, are repentant of their sins and believe the Blessed Sacrament to be the true Body and Blood of Christ are invited to receive the Sacrament of the Altar. We hope that you will enter fully into worship by joining in the prayers, responses and hymns. Because our worship may be unfamiliar to those not raised in the Episcopal Church, feel free to ask the assistance of those around you in following and participating in the liturgy. If you are in search of a church home, we invite you to join us in worship, fellowship and service. Please sign the guest register at the church entrance so we may have a record of your visit.

*Celebrant* The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Sponsor* I present Zahra Mondelli to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*Celebrant* Wilt thou be baptized in this Faith?

*Candidate* That is my desire.

*Celebrant* Dost thou renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Candidate* I renounce them all.

*Celebrant* Dost thou renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Candidate* I renounce them all.

*Celebrant* Dost thou renounce all sinful desires that draw thee from the love of God?

*Candidate* I renounce them all.

*Celebrant* Dost thou turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as thy Savior?

*Candidate* I do.

*Celebrant* Dost thou put thy whole trust in His grace and love?

*Candidate* I do.

*Celebrant* Dost thou promise to follow and obey Him as thy Lord and Master?

*Candidate* I do.

*Celebrant* Will ye who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in *her* life in Christ?

## THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

*Celebrant* Dost thou believe in God the Father?

*Celebrant* Dost thou believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People* **I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.**

*Celebrant* Wilt thou persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever thou dost fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*Celebrant* Wilt thou proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ Jesus?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Wilt thou seek and serve Christ in all men, loving thy neighbor as thyself?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Wilt thou strive for justice and peace among all men, and respect the dignity of every person?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which the Holy Ghost moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Ghost as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through His death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in His death; by which we partake in His resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Ghost. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into His fellowship them that come to Him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Now ✠sanctify this water, we beseech thee, by thy Holy Ghost, that those here are cleansed from sin and made regenerate may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior, to whom, with thee and the same Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, now and forever. **Amen.**

Give unto *her* an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. **Amen.**

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Celebrant & People* **We receive thee into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim His resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**
