Sunset Villa needs a plan!

It has become clear to many that Sunset Villa needs a strategy to remain sustainable in the future.

What do the next generations want?

We need a thoughtful discussion and input from members! Expenses are rising and will soon (in the next 5-7 years) exceed our income. We have very old buildings that need repair. Soon our dedicated older volunteers will no longer be able to help us. Replacing their work requires money to hire outside services.

We need either more volunteers or more money!

Many of us would love to see more infrastructure to bring in more income but also to provide more services to the community - seniors, campground, and Danish heritage.

We need a comprehensive repair/ replacement schedule like condos have. Our "reserve fund" is very small considering the size of our operation, and any "wrong move" will wipe us out.

How do we get there?

Sunset Villa also has tremendous assets thanks to the founders' vision. We have a 52-acre parkland oasis close to the GTA and growing communities of Guelph, Cambridge, Kitchener, Hamilton, London and beyond.

A lot of ideas, planning, research, surveys and spreadsheet work is needed! Can you help us create a plan for the near and long term future? We need all of you!

Danish-Canadian Conference

This was the first Danish-Canadian Conference in Halifax, and an opportunity to visit Pier 21, the old immigration shed, which is now the Canadian Museum of Immigration. Naturally, the theme of the Conference was Pier 21: Where we met Canada. At the opening reception of the Conference on Thursday, May 24, 2018, at the Delta Barrington Hotel, the guest speaker was Danish Ambassador Niels Boel Abrahamsen.

Friday was Museum Day, where the Danish Canadian Museum held its Annual General Meeting. The luncheon speaker was Danish Consul Melissa Mathers, a fifth-generation Danish consul. There was a guided tour to spectacular Peggy's Cove in the afternoon. In the evening there was a Museum presentation by Svend E. Nielsen as well as a presentation about explorer Jens Munk by Otto Christensen, and the work of the Danish Federation's Jens Munk Committee, by the chair, Carl Sorensen. This was followed by an auction in support of the Museum.

Saturday morning the Danish Federation held its Annual General Meeting at Pier 21. Vice-president Gert Andersen stepped down and elected new vice-president was Ed Kuhlman of Port Coquitlam. Re-elected as president, secretary and treasurer were respectively Rolf Christensen, Aase Christensen and Sune Overgaard. Moreover, Ed Kuhlman was thanked for producing an excellent Heritage

Book with a host of immigration stories. The luncheon speaker was Pier 21 historian Steven Schwinghamer, who then gave a guided tour of the premises. There was also time to do research and view the temporary exhibitions. Dinner was aboard a harbour cruise ship, which sailed along the harbour with a great view of the Halifax skyline as well as docks and container terminal, and many coves.

Sunday offered a guided bus tour which included stops at the Victorian Public Gardens, the Halifax Citadel and a cemetery with many of the victims from the Titanic.

The Conference ended with a traditional Danish luncheon at the Austenville Owls' Club in Dartmouth, catered by the Scandinavian Society of Nova Scotia. At the closing, the participants thanked Larry Kjearsgaard as chair of the Conference Organizing Committee, as well as Birgit Ballantyne, who had been "the boots on the ground" in Halifax. Finally, Larry Kjearsgaard handed the Fane and Mailbox over to Karl Sorensen of the Danish Club in Winnipeg, which will be hosting the Conference in 2019.

A seminar on various aspects of Danish Manor Houses followed, covering daily life, war, gardens, ghost stories and film. The Seminar ended with a dinner and party, where each participant chose to be a specific Count or Countess.

Æbleskiver Pans: Cast iron or electric?

We make 3,000 æbleskiver every year for Constitution Day. We have always used traditional cast iron pans, over propane heat. But over the last couple of years, some of us have been dabbling with electric æbleskiver pans.

You are probably thinking, "No! it must be done with cast iron!". However, the majority of our volunteers who try electric will not go back to the cast iron pans.

Why?

- Electric pans never burn your æbleskiver.
- Portable. Just plug in the electric pan and værsko! vs. setting up Coleman stoves under a tent outside.
- Electric pans have a Teflon coating so the æbleskivers don't stick and are easy to turn! You are almost guaranteed a perfect product.

So most of us 'pro-æblemakers' have converted to electric and will never go back.



However, we have one hold-out in our group – a volunteer named Eric Bentzen. Eric is a traditionalist and brings his own cast iron pan, handed down from his mother!



Eric has made æbleskiver for Constitution Day for 8 years. According to his family, æbleskiver is the ONLY thing Eric knows how to cook! And he cooks them to perfection. He says the key is a cast iron pan with a solid bottom.

So the debate of cast iron vs electric continues. Join us next year and decide for yourself. It's a lot of fun, you'll learn an impressive traditional skill, and you will make some new friends! Lisa Olsen



According to legend, the summer solstice is a night imbued with evil, a night in which witches make their way to the Brocken, the highest summit in the Herz mountains in northern Germany. In order to ward off those broomstick-riding witches and their evil troll accomplices, Danes light a bonfire to keep the spooky forces at bay.
