November Meeting

Joy Snowflake on Fabric

This is a fun, easy and quick project that I hope everyone will try. It's a good way to pretty up a canvas bag you picked up at a trade show or use a pillow blank from Hobby Lobby. The pillow blank shown at the meeting has a zipper so it's easy to change out designs. You can also use a scrap of fabric and just tie it over a solid pillow you already have.

Before our meeting, iron your freezer paper stencil SHINY SIDE DOWN on fabric. Cutting paper between letters & snowflake before ironing will make it easier to remove after painting. If your snowflake has little loose pieces in bag, you can iron those on for extra detail. Keep it flat until ready to paint, no wrinkles gives crisp lines. Iron another piece on the back side of your fabric or use a piece of cardboard to contain bleed through.





Use paint you already have. I used Country Red, Hauser Med. Green, Cad Yellow & Black Plum for letters; Cape Cod Blue & White for the snowflake. Fun options for the snowflake would be glitter or puff paint. Whatever makes you happy!

If you have cosmetic wedge sponges, sea sponge or a # 6 checkerboard brush bring them. I ordered 11 brushes that will be here before our meeting.

Bring your usual acrylic painting supplies. Textile medium is optional

I will bring a few extra stencils & iron for those who didn't get a stencil at last meeting.

This can be painted an any surface of your choice, Judy did say that painting it in its larger size is easier than painting a reduced version.







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Minutes-October 17. 2016

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 pm by President Beth Stodieck. Following items were discussed:

- Announcements: Show and Tell were displayed and shown to the membership from Painting Palooza in Oklahoma. Beth encouraged everyone to go next year.
- Minutes: Minutes approved as published in the newsletter.
- <u>Programs</u>: Sharlene will teach "JOY" on fabric in November. She had stencils cut for everyone tonight which need to be ironed onto your surface before coming to class. Next month bring projects to teach next year for meetings and Saturday specials. We need 8 projects for meetings and two for Saturday Specials as one of the seminars will take the place of a Saturday Special.

BOARD COMMITTEE CHAIR WORKSHEET - 2017

It's nearly time for a new year! That means it's time to start working on our Board for next year. As you've heard over and over again, this organization cannot exist without the loving, talented and dedicated people who volunteer, some year after year after year, to do the behind the scenes work that is necessary for all of us to have the awesome fun that we all look forward to. IF EVERYONE DOES ONE SMALL JOB THROUGH THE YEAR, NO ONE PERSON HAS TO CARRY THE ENTIRE CHAPTER. PLEASE consider doing your part to make our Chapter thrive!

This form has a short description (not necessarily all inclusive) of the jobs available to Chapter members. Please read them carefully and plan on volunteering to do your fair share in 2010. Most are really not nearly as hard to do as you might imagine. And being involved with the Board and Chapter decision making is really very fun and exciting.

Installation of officers will be at the Christmas Party. Please plan on volunteering to do your part. <u>Though it may mean we won't have refreshments</u>, <u>Saturday Specials</u>, <u>seminars</u>, <u>a Christmas</u> <u>Party</u>, or whatever, if we do not have people volunteer to hold an office or Committee <u>Chairmanship</u>, we will do away with that activity. We hope every member will want to be involved in 2017.

Please write "CHAIR" or "HELP" in the blanks by jobs you volunteer for:

Incoming President will contact you about your choices.

Christmas Party Chairman – With the help of a committee of her choosing, determines the theme, plans activities, coordinates decorations and ornaments, solicits raffle items/auction items as needed, plans dinner, sells dinner, raffle tickets and ornaments, attends Board meetings as necessary to keep Board informed of plans, provides a monthly article to Newsletter Chairman as needed to keep Membership informed of plans.

Newsletter - During active months, collects articles from Committee Chairs, combines it with important info from other chapters, edits and produces and sends Chapter newsletter. Paper copies sent to members without email.

Historian – Takes pictures at all Chapter events/events attended by members or solicits photos from other members of those events, and, using pictures, newsletters, mementos, etc., makes an annual scrapbook that accurately preserves memories from all Chapter activities for the year.

Hospitality – Solicit volunteers to be hostesses for each meeting, maintain and bring utensils and other supplies at each meeting, circulates sign up lists for members to sign up to bring food and decorations to meetings, provides an article for newsletter each month that lists people responsible for bringing food/decorations to next meeting and any chosen theme. (May be combined with Table Attendant)

Memory Boxes – Buys boxes for members to paint, encourages members to paint boxes as needed, keeps a record of boxes checked out to members for painting, maintains communication with hospitals who use our Memory Boxes.

Parliamentarian – Attends all Board and Chapter meetings, is knowledgeable about and provides guidance for procedural questions using the most current edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

Publicity – In the manner that she determine is best, advertises our Chapter to others in the community, serves as a contact person for people interested in coming to visit us for a meeting.

Seminars – contacts teachers of her/the Board's choosing/Chapter request about details involved in bringing those teachers to our Chapter including potential project samples/photos to be presented to the Board, including teaching fees, hotel reservations and transportation costs. Sets up classroom, arranges meals for teacher, transports teacher to and from classroom, handles sign up and collection of seminar fees, distributes patterns/surfaces to paid students. Duties such as teacher transport and meals with teacher may be delegated to other members if necessary.

Saturday Special – With the help of a committee of her choosing if needed, chooses a date, arranges a meeting place, chooses a project, buys supplies or provides members with a list of items to bring, sets a supply fee if necessary, arranges for lunch plans of her choice, provides nametags/favors if she and her committee decide to do so.

Sunshine - Collects info from members about member illness, losses, successes, milestones, etc. and provides a newsletter article including all of this info to the Newsletter Editor monthly.

Table Attendant – Arrives early to every Chapter meeting. Brings table cloths and helps cover tables. Collects tablecloths at the end of each meeting and stores them until needed again. Arranges for Seminar Chairs to get tablecloths if needed for seminars. (May be combined with Hospitality)

_____Telephone – Organizes a Committee that can quickly call/email all members with urgent info that needs to be given out before a meeting or Board meeting can be held.

Monthly Raffle – Arranges for volunteers to provide 4 or more items to be raffled at our monthly meetings. Arranges other activities for raising funds at Chapter meetings if you so desire. Sells raffle tickets and turns in money to Treasurer. Provides a monthly article listing winners from last month, donators from last month and donators for the coming month and proceeds from previous raffles if she so desires.

Birth Announcement! Oklahoma City Painting Palooza


(by definition – an all-out Crazy Event)
