Tannenbaum Forest Opens Friday

The elves have been busy for days and days getting the Festhalle ready for Amana's Tannenbaum Forest. How many volunteers does it take? Well, there are 60 live trees to decorate, the 17 foot tall Christmas pyramid to set up and get turning, the entire barn to decorate and 41 volunteer shifts to fill.

It requires at least 82 volunteers simply to keep the forest open. Plus consider the volunteers needed to open and shut the forest each day and to haul in the supplies needed such as propane for the heaters, snacks for St. Nick's Café and so on. A rough estimate is that it takes about 120 people to volunteer there time and some volunteer many hours indeed.

Yes, it takes a village to make our Tannenbaum Forest happen but what a beautiful Christmas gift we give to eastern lowa while successfully fund raising for the University of Iowa Children's Hospital. Last year a check for \$10,000 was given to the hospital to benefit the patient's support program providing toys, games, crafts and comfort items to children and their families.

The forest opens on Friday, Nov. 29 at 11 a.m. It will be open until 7 p.m. Santa will be there 1-4 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 30 the forest is open 10 a.m. -7 p.m. and Santa is there 11 a.m. -6 p.m. Sunday the forest is 11 a.m. -4 p.m and Santa is there 11 -3.
