## "Totally Unexpected" 2 Samuel 9:1-13

2 Samuel 9 contains within itself the very key concepts that relate to Jesus' D and R
Back in that ancient culture, it was a common practice for kings to E all members of a previous dynasty
But King David's response to Mephibosheth was totally U to what we might think
1) To "show kindness"—traces back to a previous promise 2) Mephibosheth went from "having it all" to "having  N at all" 3) Mephibosheth was from a place called Lo-Debar (which means "No P" (exile/wilderness)
Mephibosheth humbled H before King David
AND
1) King David honors Mephibosheth's humility and shame, yet still gives him H and A
2) King David gives Mephibosheth L (even a "New L")
3) King David gives Mephibosheth a S of the K
4) King David gives Mephibosheth a P at his T
5) King David gives Mephibosheth S
Perhaps YOU are now ready to accept the F G of the King of kings through faith? And to step into His P
