I wanted to take a moment to highlight some economic development work happening in the city that, while not glamorous, will make a big impact in the years to come. City Council has approved three new 30-year, Tax Increment Financing Districts (TIFs) in the city. TIFs are an economic development tool that allow taxes associated with any increased value of property to be used for public improvements like new roads, infrastructure and streetscapes.

The three new districts approved include the Downtown District (extending from Liberty Street to State Street and up to East Prospect Street and Jackson Street), the Richmond District (extending from Painesville Square up to State Route 2 on Richmond Street), and the Chester Street District (centering around Avery Dennison's campus at 250 Chester Street).

The taxes generated from these properties will be directed into infrastructure improvements in that district thus enabling the city to fund some of these bigger projects. These public infrastructure improvements can include anything from paving roadways, public utility improvements, environmental/health improvements, stormwater improvements, demolitions, parks, streetscapes, additional landscaping and professional services.

City Council's intent is that by having TIF districts in place, the city will create more public/private partnership opportunities and new investments that will enhance any new development occurring.

City Spotlight: Public Works Traffic Crew

Traffic signals are designed to ensure an orderly and safe flow of vehicles and provide an opportunity to safely cross the street for pedestrians. At Painesville's Public Works Department, there are two full-time employees dedicated to maintaining and repairing traffic signs, signals and road marking that you probably interact with on a daily basis.

These committed employees are responsible for repairing and maintaining traffic signals and signs continuously and are often called in for emergency repairs

and malfunctions. As a safety reminder, if you approach a signal that is not working, always treat it as a four-way stop and proceed with caution!

Along with the duties of traffic signal work, these employees also run the City's sign shop. All city posted signs, street signs, directional signs, road work signs, etc. are produced in the Painesville Public Works garage. Making signs internally ensures the quality of the work and saves the community money. Plus no waiting for delivery, signs can be made on the spot.

Reminder for Residents: Open Burning Law & Recreational Fires

The Painesville City Fire Department has seen an increase in the amount of calls received about open burning complaints.

As a reminder, open burning is prohibited in Painesville City

except as defined in Ordinance 560.08. Open burning is allowed for:

- Heating tar, welding acetylene torches, highway safety flares, heating for warmth of outdoor

workers and strikers, smudge pots and similar occupational needs, and;

- Bonfires (by permit), campfires and outdoor fireplace equipment, whether for cooking

food for human consumption, pleasure, religious, ceremonial, warmth, recreational or similar purposes, if the following conditions are met:

- o Fuel must be either clean, seasoned firewood, natural gas or equivalent, or any clean burning fuel with emissions that are equivalent to or lower than those created by burning seasoned firewood;
- o Fires cannot be used for waste disposal purposes
- o Fires must not exceed 3 feet in diameter or 2 feet in height.
- o Must be at least 25ft from a

structure (50ft for bonfires)

o Fires must be attended (cannot be left abandoned) and an extinguishing agent (garden hose or similar) is required.

Please do not burn trash, old furniture, etc. This is an illegal activity and may result in a citation. PCFD will respond to complaints of open burning and will enforce City Ordinances.

Be considerate of your neighbors and burn clean, seasoned firewood that does not make objectionable smoke, so that everyone can safely enjoy their outdoor activities!

The Public Works Department appreciates residents' assistance in preventing flooding and water run-off. If you have a storm sewer outlet in front of your home, please clean it off regularly by removing any leaves, sticks and debris. This

small preventative measure goes a long way in preventing flooding.

If the storm sewer outlet should become blocked and you are unable to clear it, or you see it is not draining properly, contact the Public Works Department for assistance at 440-392-9676. Please remember to never remove a sewer cover, as they are heavy and a risk to injury.

Winter decorations may be placed beginning November 15. Artificial decorations are allowed during winter months only and must be removed by March 1 for the spring clean-up.

Another approach is to ask your dentist whether he or she participates in a dental savings plan. These work like warehouse clubs where you pay an annual fee for discounts of up to 60% on check-ups, cleanings, root canals, crowns, and bridges.

N State Street Road Project

Nothing says summer in Ohio like orange barrels. The biggest road project the city is undertaking this year N State Street, from Storrs Street to Skinner Ave. The construction timeline has been set from August 16 through November 2. At least one lane of traffic will be maintained throughout the project, but motorists should expect delays.

Various other city roads will be paved starting September 20

through October 22. They include Sterling Ave, a small section of N St. Clair Street near the Fairport Harbor bridge, a small section of Elm Street near the railroad tracks and Erie Street, Paige Place, Nottingham Place and Stonehaven Drive. Button Ave, a 2020 road project that was placed on hold due to state funding delays and material shortages, is scheduled to be complete by September 16.

Bankruptcy 101:

The two types of bankruptcy that most people hear about are chapter 7 and chapter 13. The word chapter refers to the chapter (like in a book) in the bankruptcy code. Chapter 7 is a liquidating

bankruptcy and chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy. Liquidating means they (the government) can take your stuff. Non-liquidating means they can't. However, there are

exceptions to this. I will try to lay this out in a simplistic fashion:

In a chapter 7 you will be able to discharge all of your debts without paying anything back. However, if you have any equity in anything (your home, your car, your bank account, your boat- anything) you must surrender it to the bankruptcy trustee (the person who looks out for the creditors) so that it can be sold (liquidated) to pay back the creditors to the largest extent possible. Equity is what determines which chapter of bankruptcy you can file under. Fair Market Value minus Amount Owed equals Your Equity in anything.

A chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy.

This means you get to keep everything, but you have to pay back a percentage of your equity. It is also used for people who are in foreclosure or behind on their mortgage and in fear of foreclosure. A chapter 13 requires a payback plan from between three to five years. The payment is monthly. The amount is determined, again, by the amount of equity you have accumulated in your life. This is referred to as your bankruptcy estate. Obviously, everyone wants to do a chapter 7 because it is no pay back. However, since 2005 it has become much harder to file chapter 7. In 2005, legislation was passed which tightened up the income restrictions on people with regard to the Chapter 7

bankruptcy. The intended result was that more people must file under Chapter 13 of the Bankruptcy code and pay back, at least, what the government thinks they can afford.

It is the bankruptcy attorney's job to advise you which is the best chapter to file under. It is also the attorney's job to make sure you keep your home, your car, and everything else you have accumulated throughout your life.

A good bankruptcy attorney will do those all of those things. He or She will also stop the creditors from harassing you, protect you from lawsuits, garnishments, put you back on your feet and give you a fresh start in life.







Safe Dog Handling for Seniors

Owning a pet can contribute to better health and a more active lifestyle. As more seniors become/continue to be pet owners, the benefits of owning a pet dog may come with some unfortunate side effects.

A recent University of Pennsylvania study found emergency room patients 65 and older with injuries from walking leashed dogs increased from 1,671 injuries in 2004 to nearly 4,400 in 2017. Nearly 80 percent of those patients were women, most commonly with hip fractures followed by injuries to the wrist or upper arm.

While some of these incidents can be attributed to the environment (slippery sidewalks etc.) many of the incidents were likely a result of a dog that was not trained to walk on leash. Leash skills are critical for any dog owner, but become increasingly important as the dog-owning population ages and more seniors are enjoying pet ownership.

Things to consider if you

are a senior or know a senior considering adding a dog to the household:

Although researching in Ireland can be a wonderful experience, research at home is key to successful Irish research. The fire at Four Courts in 1922 (the Public Records Office) was devastating, but contrary to popular belief, not ALL records were destroyed.


