DWM makes budgeted financial donations to several important causes and organizations (Heifer Project, Special Olympics, Share the Harvest, Kids Harbor, Medical Mission for Christ, Helping Hands, Habitat for Humanity, Woodhaven, and the CCC General budget). In addition, we provide active participation in the following:

Ecumenical:

Coalition to Stop Human Trafficking – Sara Brown is CCC’s representative on the Coalition to Stop Human Trafficking, a local effort organized by St. George Episcopal Church. Be informed and Participate!

Festival of Sharing: Sara Reiter – DWF promotes CCC’s annual giving to the Festival. Items for distribution through Church World Service (collected, assembled, and delivered) or a cash donation of \$2000 is given. Information is available June - September. Rainbow Network: Sara Reiter - Pre-owned shoes are collected in Fellowship Hall and delivered to Rainbow Network in Springfield for distribution to communities serving impoverished persons in rural Nicaragua. Donate shoes!

Blessing Box Offerings - Rosemarie Taylor - In gratitude for the blessings of life, the spiritual discipline of giving to help others provides money to support the mission of the church. Disciples Women’s Ministries turn hope into reality by saving money through personal “blessing boxes.” Each September, these offerings are dedicated and added to Blessing Box offerings from Disciples Women throughout the world.
