Guinness Book of Records here we come! Subject to confirmation, we will shortly have the name of a Rolls-Royce Harrier in that august publication!

In order to raise money for the Rainbows Children's Hospice, Jon Kinder decided to make an attempt on the world record for a 12 hour run on a treadmill. The treadmill was set up in the Cornmarket, Derby, on Saturday 27th February, with the generous support of the adjacent Book Café, and Jon ran continuously (with the exception of hourly comfort breaks) from 8.20am to 8.20pm. Curious passers-by were encouraged to contribute to the Rainbows collection buckets, and quite a crowd gathered as the clock ticked towards 8.20pm, culminating in a huge round of applause as the old record was passed with just under ten minutes to go! Playing to the crowd, and belying his shy and retiring nature, Jon increased the pace for a sprint finish. The old record stood at 131.35km, and unofficially (see the small print below), Jon's new record is 132.90km.

All of this is subject to calibration of the equipment, according to the records kept by Jon's official witnesses, timekeepers and recorders, submission of the records to and ratification by the Guinness officials. As Jon commented a couple of days later, preparing the paperwork and evidence is a marathon in itself! However, from observations on the day, we believe the treadmill was understating the distance, and we hope that the official record will be higher. At the last count, £2,876 had been raised for the Rainbows Hospice.



NATIONAL FOREST WAY, JANUARY 9TH – 10TH 2016

This relatively new national trail links the National Memorial Arboretum near Alrewas in Staffordshire with Beacon Hill in Leicestershire, roughly 20 miles apart, as any sober crow will testify. The trail manages to meander some 75 miles through pleasant, though largely unremarkable, countryside. Perfect for a modest Harriers Winter Mini-Epic relay! Being so close to home, this one could be tackled in daylight over two days, with no need to arrange overnight accommodation, by a team of fifteen runners (one of them canine), with one minibus, one car and a baby buggy. (The car and the buggy allowed Amanda and Robin to introduce 5-month old Emelie to long-distance running without the need to expose her to the horror of a minibus full of sweaty, muddy runners and their festering kit!). Much of the route runs in, or close to, the Trent flood plain, and after the long spell of mild wet weather, some of it ran under the Trent, causing a one mile deviation at one point, and wet feet at many others. Sunday was the better day weather-wise, and we all felt the last three stages, through Bradgate Park and up to Beacon Hill, were the best, with the view from Beacon Hill as the sun went down well worth the effort.

Jon Kinder, Keith Covell and Bryan Carr ran the full 75 miles. Varying distances were run by Bob Bond, Amanda and Robin Carter, Chris Clarke, Andy Dodsley, Alan Eccleston, Karolina Kucharek, Steve Leach, Darren Potter, Mark Rogerson, Bill Southgate and Hollie the collie.

On his way to a run at Bosworth in rural Leicestershire kind-hearted Pete stopped his car to rescue some stray sheep. But he was attacked by a sheepdog and had to make a diversion to Derbyshire Royal Infirmary for urgent treatment to a nasty leg wound. Only recently returned, Pete said afterwards that he definitely has no plans to make a new career as a shepherd." No bulletin was issued on the health of the sheepdog......

CHARITY RUNS 1980, 1981 AND 1982

No more details of the 1981 and 1982 events came to light after the last newsletter, except a cutting from the Rolls-Royce News, reproduced below. With help from Clive Bellamy, I was able to name everyone in the photo except two, who may have been officials from the charity. Clive kindly lent me a box full of scrapbooks from the 1970s and 1980s, which helped me to extend the club archive considerably, including Dovedale Dash results for almost every year from 1976.

Complete news to me was the fact that there had been a charity relay in 1980 as well as 1981 and 1982. The 1980 event was a 90-mile, three-lap relay, each lap consisting of ten stages. Clive ran a stage from the old Derby Rugby Club on Kedleston Road to the Allestree Park entrance on the A6. His scrapbook also had a list of the runners allocated to each stage, but the stages were identified only by number, not location. £814 was raised for charity, and the sponsor whose guess was closest to the actual time, 9:27:27, Jackie Walker, won airline tickets. If anyone has any more details, please let me know. And thanks Clive for all your help.

RR NEWS NOVEMBER 1981



THE HARRIERS took a break for our photographer on a wet and windy night during their 200-mile all-night relay run for the disabled.

Battered by gale force winds and torrential rain the Rolls-Royce heroes fought their way round the clock on the Moor Lane track to raise money for Derby and District Spastics Society.

And after 24 hours the 40 runners had completed 222 miles 18 yd 2 ft precisely.

Derby workers paid for the privilege of guessing the distance run bringing in £550 for the good cause.

As the runners pounded round the track Derby County

Captain Steve Powell dropped in to help with a few laps – only three hours after a key match in Sheffield.

Said Harrier Clive Bellamy: "All our team turned up to do their duty stints of 30 minutes or one hour.

"There were sighs of relief as they passed their promised minimum of 200 miles." Said Clive: "We want to thank

Said Clive: "We want to thank everyone who supported us especially the Pavilion regulars who gave so generously." Winner of the portable television for guessing the distance run was Ken Davison, Sinfin B.

Soon afterwards a Harriers team took fourth place in the Nottingham Robin Hood 'half marathon' achieved in a field of 3,000 runners. The first Harriers home were Mick Lawson of the Stress Office (32nd), Ken Northard, Ken Broadhurst and Alfie Titterton. Ken and Alfie also won as individuals the over 50 and over 45 age groups – to win binoculars.
