One evening an old Cherokee chief told his grandson about a battle that goes on inside people.

He said, "My son, the battle is between two wolves. One is Evil. It is anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority and ego."

"The other is Good. It is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion and faith."

The grandson thought about it for a minute and then asked, "Grandfather, which wolf wins?"

The old Cherokee chief simply replied, "The one you feed."

I share this story with you because even in this joyful season of Easter, we know that we still live in challenging times, and in challenging times I think it is especially important for us to guard our hearts. It is so easy in times like these to fall into apathy on the one hand, or anger on the other.

It is important to stand up for what you believe, to work for what you think is right, to avoid the apathy that our confusing, polarized politics can so easily bring on. Even when problems seem overwhelming to us, we need to celebrate that even one person can make a difference, and remember that nearly every great achievement in history was accomplished by regular people, who decided to step out in faith that their efforts would make a difference.

At the same time, we need to be careful that our anxiety doesn't shift to anger or resentment. Such feelings are normal, surely, but if we focus only on them we find ourselves making rash choices and errors in judgment. Worse yet, if our hearts are filled with anger and resentment, there is little room for the openness and creativity that so often is needed to address the roots of our circumstances.

In challenging times, we need to guard our hearts against apathy and anger... we need to feed the good wolf, so that we can find the courage and strength to work for what is good. That's the advice we find in Paul's letter to the Romans, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." With that as our commitment and our focus, God will surely be at work through us even in our most challenging moments. That's my prayer for each of us!
