A LOVING AND COMPASSIONATE GOD

2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13; Ps. 32:1-2, 5, 7, 11; Gal. 2:16, 19-21; Luke 7:36-8:3

The second Book of Samuel (11:2-27) tells the unfortunate story of human weakness, sin and its immediate consequences. David was a wealthy and successful king. One afternoon, overcome by his lust, he invited in Bathsheba, the wife of one of his army officers, Uriah, and committed adultery with her. When she became pregnant, David attempted to cover up his crime by having Uriah placed by the army commanders in a position where he would be killed. Unfortunately, Uriah was killed in battle. David later took Bathsheba as his wife. The Lord God was displeased with what David had done.

In 2 Samuel 12:1-15, the Lord sent His prophet, Nathan, to David to confront David about his sinful acts. Through Nathan, the Lord reminded David how gracious He had been to him, and how He, the Lord, had been generous and could have continued to be generous to David had he requested any good thing from Him. Instead, "Why have you spurned the Lord and done evil in His sight?" The Lord further threatened to destroy David and his entire household. David was humbled. He admitted his faults, regretted his actions and said to Prophet Nathan: "I have sinned against the Lord." Nathan replied and said to him: "The Lord on His part has forgiven your sin: you shall not die."

By his actions, David had sinned gravely. He did not only commit adultery, but he also destroyed a life in the process. In contemporary society, the justice system would have prosecuted him for adultery, homicide and concealing of evidence; and if convicted, he would have spent the rest of his life in jail. In the undemocratic judicial systems, David would be executed, hanged, or stone to death for his crimes. But the difference is that our God is all loving, merciful, and compassionate. Thus, in Psalm 130:3 we read: "If You, O Lord should mark our evil (guilt), Lord, who could survive? But with You is forgiveness, and for that You are revered."

Yes indeed, the God you and I worship and serve is full of mercy and compassion. He is always ready to forgive our sins when we acknowledge our sins and return to Him with a humble and contrite heart. Like David, we may still have to fulfill our penance and compensate for our bad judgments and sinful acts, but God "on His part has forgiven you, and you shall not die." Unlike the justice system and unlike the Pharisee, Simon, as we honor all our fathers on this Fathers' Day, we pray that in all families, fathers will always be a sign of love and reconciliation. We pray that, unlike David, our fathers, by their words and actions, will be good role models to their wives and children and always be faithful to them. Unlike Simon, the Pharisee, in today's gospel, we pray that all of us will be slow to condemn others and be a living sign of God's love and compassion. On this Father's Day I exhort all fathers to have the humility of David and that of the "sinful woman" to admit to their faults and ask for forgiveness whenever they are not living up to the expectations of their wives and other members of the family. And may we always hear the Lord say to us through our loved ones, "I have forgiven you...you shall not die," in today's gospel, God does not judge nor condemn you. Like the "sinful woman" in the gospel, the Lord invites you and me to be humble, admit our faults, refrain from our sinfulness and return to Him Who loves us in spite of ourselves. He invites you to come to Him in the sacrament of reconciliation, where He will touch you and say to you, "Your sins are forgiven...Your faith has saved you, go in peace."





UNDERSTANDING & PARTICIPATING IN THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH IN THIS YEAR OF FAITH



As summer approaches it might serve the Church well if we celebrate the *Year of Faith* by reading and meditating on one or more of the documents of the Second Vatican Council. Because it is fifty years since its being convoked by Blessed John XXIII and then Venerable Paul VI, many faithful, clerical and lay, have not taken the opportunity to read its works. In view of many misunderstandings and

misstatements of well-known individuals it might be beneficial to examine, this week, the Decree on the Apostolate of Lay People. In calling for the participation of the laity in the Church's mission its introduction states: "All the more urgent has this Apostolate become, now that autonomy - as is only right - has been reached in numerous sectors of human life, sometimes with a certain relinquishing of moral and religious values, seriously jeopardizing the Christian life ... It is hard to see how the Church could make her presence and action felt without the help of the laity."

In its second chapter the Council Fathers made clear that the "mission of the Church, ... is not only to bring men the message and grace of Christ but also to permeate and improve the whole range of the temporal. ... The layperson, at one and at the same time a believer and a citizen of the world, has only a single conscience, a Christian conscience; it is by this that he must be guided continually in both domains." What is established by these words are three interrelated truths. The baptized person must, each in his or her own way, be involved in the Apostolate of the Church, as a catechist, liturgical minister, and dispenser of charity; or provide some sort of service; in the family, as a guiding parent or guardian, religious model, and loving spouse; in the world, as an ethical witness promoter of justice, and protector of life. Second, one cannot decide to surrender one's values because of possible negative responses from others or because of one's position in business or government. While it is true that none of us have the right to coerce another to accept our view of an issue, we do not have the right to forget that we are called to witness to the truth. If we fail to honor our commitment to the Church's faith and morals, we are placing ourselves outside the People of God. Third, the fact that we are a part of the Catholic Church does not mean simply that we must follow her teachings but it also means that when we stand up and sing the Lord's praises, beseech God's help, and witness to the verities of life, we are not alone: our brothers and sisters are one with us under the headship of

Pope Francis in speaking to the crowds of his public audiences, visiting communities of priests and religious, and reaching out to the parishioners of his diocese of Rome is showing the way of joyful witness, let us be united with him in Christian prayer and action.
