# VILLAGE OF DRYDEN REGULAR MEETING LAMB MEMORIAL BUILDING May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012

Dryden Township Police Chief, Larry Pack reviewed the attached monthly report for April.

**MOTION** by Quail, supported by Nash, to approve the May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 agenda as presented.

Council voiced all ayes, Motion carried

#### **Financial Statements:**

President Betcher asked a question regarding setting the millage rate and the date of the audit.

**MOTION** by Roszczewski, supported by Quail, to approve the revised May Bills to Pay in the amount of \$ 36,070.57 and to accept April 2012 Disbursements in the amount of \$ 24,433.91 as attached. *Roll call vote*: Jones-y, Nash-y, Roszczewski-y, Quail-y, Betcher-y

Motion carried 5-0.

**DPW Report:** DPW Supervisor, John Ihrke:

- Discharged cell #2 in March. Due to the algae created by the warm weather Supervisor Ihrke was unable to do a complete discharge of the sewer lagoons. He transferred water from cell #1 to cell #2 and used thirty-two barrels of ferric chloride He talked with DEQ to request an extension and they suggested that he write a letter with an explanation.
- Last month a bid was approved for the well rehab. The rehab is now completed. Samples came back good and the well has been online for two days. It will be 10 to

15 years before another rehab is needed.

• Bids for asphalt paving and crack filling for the village were received from several contractors per the spec sheets provided. The bids were received as follows:

Council decided to hold off on approving a bid until after the Downtown Development Authority reviewed the bids for the downtown area at their next meeting to be held on May 15th.

**Building & Zoning Official, Gyrome Edwards Report**: See attached report dated April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2012

Gyrome Edwards asked council what detail they would like to see on his monthly reports. He also stated that two buildings on North Street are shown as being in the commercial district and he feels the zoning should be industrial. He also requested that council consider raising the rate of pay to the building inspectors from thirty dollars to forty dollars and inspection due to outside rising costs.

**MOTION** by Nash, supported by Quail, to approve a pay increase for inspectors from thirty dollars to forty dollars per inspection fee for building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing and fire inspections.

*Roll call vote*: Jones-y, Nash-y, Roszczewski-y, Quail-y, Betcher-y Motion carried 5-0.

**MOTION** by Roszczewski, supported by Quail to make the pay increase for the inspectors retroactive for the month of April. Council voiced all ayes, Motion carried
