The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. Do not give anyone food who refuses to work.

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow. We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Your endurance will win you your life.

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place? 'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, '"I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

Your Endurance Will Win You Your Lives

The Gospel this week is unsettling if read as a description for the end of the world and what will be the signs of the last days. Every natural and human disaster like the devastating bushfires raging across our land; concerted acts of aggression and violence, the prediction of extreme consequences of global warming - all these, throughout history have aroused despair and fear that the 'end' is near. On the other hand they can also motivate human beings to heroic acts of compassion and solidarity that save lives.

Jesus' teaching in today's Gospel occurs in Jerusalem, prior to events leading to his crucifixion. His predictions are disturbing. The language is apocalyptic, symbolic, depicting current circumstances but designed to give hope to early Christian communities presently threatened with persecution and expulsion from the synagogues for their faith in Jesus as the messiah to come.

Jesus also predicts the destruction of the Jerusalem temple by the Romans and thousands of people will be martyred or forced into exile. This will be a divesting blow to the Jewish cultural and religious identity. Luke encourages the Christians to perse-

vere and not to lose hope. The good news is that though they will experience upheaval, they must never lose hope in the faithfulness and mercy of God, to bring salvation to those who remain faithful.

In life, situations of destruction are always devastating but not the end. Out of destructive bushfires springs new vegetation, the determination to rebuild and appreciate every moment of existence. From human damage of the natural environments emerge new drives to respect and preserve life. From the horrifying realisation of the genocide of peoples in times of war, came the recognition and declaration of universal human rights in the resolution: "Never again!!!" From the revelation of abuse of the young and innocent,



rise courageous survivors and advocates determined to create communities in which the vulnerable will be protected.

In all times, we are called through Jesus to be witness in heart, word and deed to God's merciful love for all of creation. On this World Day of the Poor, as we give thanks for those who dedicate their lives to bring relief to our brothers and sisters suffering various forms of poverty, isolation and exile, let us pray that the Spirit of God will enable us to love, not in word, but in deed.

World Day of the Poor

The third World Day of the Poor, which is observed on Sunday 17th November, focuses on the theme "the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever".

Taken from the Book of Psalms, Pope Francis said those words "express a pro-

found truth that faith impresses above all on the hearts of the poor, restoring lost hope in the face of injustice, sufferings and the uncertainties of life".

Today, too, Pope Francis says: "we must acknowledge many new forms of bondage that enslave millions of men, women, young people and children". Daily we encounter families forced to leave their homeland to seek a living elsewhere; orphans who have lost their parents or were violently torn from them by brutal means of exploitation; young people seeking professional fulfilment but prevented from employment by short-sighted economic policies; victims of different kinds of violence, ranging from prostitution to the narcotics trade, and profoundly demeaned. How can we overlook, too, the millions of immigrants who fall victim to any number of concealed interests, often exploited for political advantage, and are refused solidarity and equality? And all the homeless and ostracised persons who roam the streets of our cities?"

Parramatta Bishop Vincent Long van Nguyen OFM Conv Chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, paid tribute to the thousands upon thousands who volunteer in Catholic organisations across Australia to assist those in need. "They work in our jails, in charitable organisations with those who have fallen on hard times, and they help the most vulnerable members of our community," Bishop Long stated. For this third World Day of the Poor, we say thank you to each and every one of our volunteers. Know that your work is bringing hope to the lives of the poor and poor in spirit.
