





READING Job 1: 1-22

A reading from Job.

¹There was once a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job. That man was blameless and upright, one who feared God and turned away from evil. 2There were born to him seven sons and three daughters. 3He had seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen, five hundred donkeys, and very many servants; so that this man was the greatest of all the people of the east. 4His sons used to go and hold feasts in one another's houses in turn; and they would send and invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. 5And when the feast days had run their course, Job would send and sanctify them, and he would rise early in the morning and offer burnt offerings according to the number of them all; for Job said, "It may be that my children have sinned, and hearts." This what their Tob always cursed God in 6One day the heavenly beings came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan also came among them. 7The LORD said to Satan, "Where have you come from?" Satan answered the LORD, "From going to and fro on the earth, and from walking up and down on it." 8The LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job? There is no one like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man who fears God and turns away from evil." Then Satan answered the LORD, "Does Job fear God for nothing? 10 Have you not put a fence around him and his house and all that he has, on every side? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land. 11But stretch out your hand now, and touch all that he has, and he will curse you to your face." 12The LORD said to Satan, "Very well, all that he has is in your power; only do not stretch out your hand out from presence of the Satan went the him!" against ¹³One day when his sons and daughters were eating and drinking wine in the eldest brother's house, 14a messenger came to Job and said, "The oxen were plowing and the donkeys were feeding beside them, 15 and the Sabeans fell on them and carried them off, and killed the servants with the edge of the sword; I alone have escaped to tell you." ¹⁶While he was still speaking, another came and said, "The fire of God fell from heaven

and burned up the sheep and the servants, and consumed them; I alone have escaped to tell you." ¹⁷While he was still speaking, another came and said, "The Chaldeans formed three columns, made a raid on the camels and carried them off, and killed the servants with the edge of the sword; I alone have escaped to tell you." ¹⁸While he was still speaking, another came and said, "Your sons and daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house, ¹⁹and suddenly a great wind came across the desert, struck the four corners of the house, and it fell on the young people, and they are dead; I alone have escaped to tell you."

²⁰Then Job arose, tore his robe, shaved his head, and fell on the ground and worshiped. ²¹He said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return there; the LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD." ²²In all this Job did not sin or charge God with wrongdoing.

¹Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all you lands!


²Serve the LORD with gladness; come into God's presence with a song.

GOSPEL: Job 3: 1-10; 4: 1-9; 7: 11-21

The holy gospel according to Job. Glory to you, O Lord.

¹After this Job opened his mouth and cursed the day of his birth. ²Job said: ³"Let the day perish in which I was born, and the night that said, 'A man-child is conceived.' 4Let that day be darkness! May God above not seek it, or light shine on it. 5Let gloom and deep darkness claim it. Let clouds settle upon it; let the blackness of the day terrify it. 6That night — let thick darkness seize it! let it not rejoice among the days of the year; let it not come into the number of the months. Yes, let that night be barren; let no joyful cry be 8Let those curse it who curse the Sea, those who are skilled to rouse up Leviathan. 9Let the stars of its dawn be dark; let it hope for light, but have none; may it not see the eyelids of the morning — 10 because it did not shut the doors of my mother's womb, and hide trouble from my eyes. ¹Then Eliphaz the Temanite answered: 2"If one ventures a word with you, will you be offended? But who can keep from speaking? 3See, you have instructed many; you have strengthened the weak hands. 4Your words have supported those who were stumbling, and you have made firm the feeble knees. 5But now it has come to you, and you are impatient; it touches you, and you are dismayed. Is not your fear of God your confidence, and the integrity of your ways your hope? 7"Think now, who that was innocent ever perished? Or where were the upright cut off? 8As I have seen, those who plow iniquity and sow trouble reap the same. 9By the breath of God they perish, and by the blast of his anger they are consumed.

11"Therefore I will not restrain my mouth; I will speak in the anguish of my spirit; I will complain in the bitterness of my soul. 12Am I the Sea, or the Dragon, that you set a guard over me? 13When I say, 'My bed will comfort me, my couch will ease my complaint,' 14then you scare me with dreams and terrify me with visions, 15so that I would choose strangling and death rather than this body. 16I loathe my life; I would not live forever. Let me alone, for my days are a breath. 17What are human beings, that you make so much of them, that you set your mind on them, 18visit them every morning, test them every moment? 19Will you not look away from me for a while, let me alone until I


swallow my spittle?

The Lord be with you.



we give you thanks and praise.




BLESSING

What coming to a Sunday service will look like in Phase 2:

First and foremost, if you are feeling ill, or think you may have been in contact with someone who has been infected with the coronavirus, please stay home. Thank you.

- Please don't feel pressured to attend live services, they are for those interested. If you are at all vulnerable or are in contact with others who are vulnerable, we recommend that you continue to participate virtually.
- Please bring your own mask and wear it throughout the time you are in the church.
- Please try and refrain from using the church's restroom, but if you need to, be prepared to sanitize the restroom after you (or your child) use it.
- It has been shown that singing or other loud vocalizations spread the coronavirus up to 25 ft, so no congregants can sing.
- We want to keep folks from being in close proximity to one another so as you enter you please fill in the front of the church first, sitting in the areas that have bulletins, then exiting from the back rows to keep people from walking past one another.
- We will be entering from one entrance and leaving from another, this will be clearly marked. Please use the hand sanitizer provided as you enter and leave.
- Unfortunately, we still can't hang around for a coffee hour inside. You are welcome to visit on the green.
- For purposes of contact tracing, we will have greeters who will be taking everyone's name down as you enter the church.
- We can only allow so many people in the church. If we reach a number that is beyond our ability to socially distance, we may have to turn some people away. Unfortunately, this number will depend on how many people are in various households, so we can't say with certainty what that number is.
- We will continue to livestream the service, so until the new sound system is installed, there will be some equipment upfront.
- Communion will not be served regularly, but we will share drive thru communion occasionally.
- The health and safety of our members is foremost in our efforts. Be well and God bless you.
