PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE

As we started to focus on Luke, we realized that he writes in different literary styles. The initial four vers-

es of the book are written in single Greek format. The language is formal and refined. It changes later. In a way, Luke tells the same basic story. In Luke's remembrance of Jesus, we find the emphasis on God's compassion as Jesus reaches out to live and work among the marginal members of society.

During October, we will find ourselves primarily in Luke's scriptures 17:1-10, 17:11-19, 18:1-8, 18: 9-14, and 19:1-10. I encourage you to spend time with Luke paying attention to scriptures we do and do not cover in chapters 17, 18, and 19.



MISSION FOCUS

Thank you to everyone who donated items for PATH in September. These young people who have been in foster care lack a support system for furnishing their first apartments. Thank you for being that support system, and showing them that someone cares.

In October, we will be raising funds for the food program at Mpangua school in Kenya. Mpangua is located in a mission area of Chogoria. Because it is so poor, and separated by a river from the larger community, they did not have a school within walking distance for the children. One young woman, who managed to graduate from high school, teaching her young neighbors under a tree. Northern Plains Presbytery worked with Chogoria Presbytery to build an elementary school for the children. (Remember the cardboard "bricks?") The children still walk a long distance to school every day, and count on the noon meal served at the school. It is a very poor area, and the recent drought has increased the lack of food in their homes. Last year, the school ran out of food long before the school year was over.

We hope to provide funds to supplement the amount of food the school has for this school year. Kenya does not have an equivalent to the USDA that provides hot lunch for the students. The school receives some funding to buy rice, corn, and oil, which is prepared by volunteer parents and others to feed the children. In good times, the parents supplement the groceries with donations from their resources, but because of the drought, this cannot happen this year.

On October 2nd, during worship, we will be commissioning Pastor Cathie and Carrie Leopold to travel to Kenya with others from our presbytery to help Chogoria Presbyteries celebrate their centennial. During their time there, Carrie hopes to upload videos for our Minutes for Mission, showing us the Mpangua school program.

IS GOD CALLING YOU?

served two consecutive three-year terms as Trustees. The Nominating Committee will be looking for two members to fill those seats.

The Trustees are responsible for the maintenance of the church's physical property. This includes overseeing the janitors. In addition, it entails working with the fire marshal and seeing to it that safety reports on the fire alarm system, sprinkler system, and elevator are completed and acted upon when neces-The maintenance of the church also requires the trustees to: contract with a snow removal company, an elevator inspection/repair service, and a pest elimination company. Finally, the trustees maintain the grounds of the property by mowing and spraying the lawn, including spraying of the sidewalks and parking lots to control weeds.

It's a group Trustee effort to maintain the church's physical property. Please consider filling one of these spots when the Nominating Committee calls you.
