DAVIDSEN DRESS FOR SUCCESS POLICY

<u>TOPS</u>: Every Monday-Thursday- All students will wear a short or long-sleeved navy blue, black or grey collared Davidsen logo polo shirt (will be available to purchase online through Davidsen PTSA) or a plain collared (no logo) polo shirt. Students may wear any Davidsen Spirit shirt <u>on Fridays only</u>.

<u>BOTTOMS</u>: Every Monday-Friday- <u>CHANGE FOR 23-24</u>-All students will wear solid khaki or blue jean trousers, pants, walking shorts (finger-tip length), jumpers, skirts, or capri length bottoms (no black bottoms). The uniform bottoms may be purchased at any retail location. Clothing with tears above the knee shall <u>not</u> be worn. All bottoms must be secured at the waist. **BIKER SHORTS, PAJAMAS, GYM SHORTS, YOGA PANTS, or LEGGINGS ARE NOT PERMITTED**.

SHOES: Athletic type shoes are recommended. No slippers, slides, wheeled shoes, or shoes with lights are permitted. All shoes must have a back or strap worn on the heel.

<u>HATS/HEADWEAR</u>: No hats, hoods, bandanas, headbands, or sweatbands are allowed on campus unless required for religious observance or health related reasons. No headphones, Airpods, or earbuds are to be worn on campus unless directed by a teacher.

OUTERWEAR: CHANGE FOR 23-24- NO HOODIES ARE TO BE ON CAMPUS. Sweatshirts with the DAVIDSEN Logo or a solid plain sweatshirt (grey, navy, or black) are the only acceptable types and colors that must be worn over the uniform shirt. A solid long sleeve navy, black, or grey shirt may be worn UNDER the uniform shirt. In extreme weather: jackets with a zipper may be worn. No other outerwear (long sleeve shirts, flannels, blankets, vests, etc.) is to be worn at any time.

PE Uniforms are only to be worn during PE class

Students must be in uniform as well as always adhering to the Hillsborough County Dress Code Policy during school hours (refer to handbook). Students will be monitored in the morning and in homeroom. Any violations must be addressed at that time and corrected. If a student can correct the violation, the student will be allowed to remain in class. Students out of uniform or in violation of dress code will be offered a change of clothes to remedy the violation or asked to call home for a change of clothes. Students may wait in ISS until other clothes arrive or until the end of the day.

Consequences for not following the uniform policy:

1st time Change of clothing

2nd time Change of clothing, parent notified

3rd time Change of clothing, parent notified, detention

4th time Change of clothing, parent notified, formal administrative consequences

5th time or more Addressed by Student Affairs Administrator

Excessive uniform violations may result in loss of privileges to include field trips, incentives, and afterschool events. Uniform violations reset every 9 weeks.
