Greetings! You are all loved by God and are called to be his own. May God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ give you

grace and peace. (New Living Translation/NLT)

Every time I sit down to write to you, I am amazed that another month has passed. The last few months have been chaotic at best. It is impossible to talk about our experiences without bringing up the name Covid-19. It has become a mantra, a symbol of illness, fear, and death.

Most people have accepted the fact that they need to be vigilant in what they do, where they go, and who they spend time with. It is hard for grandmas and grandpas to stay away from their children and grandchildren. Family members miss being with one another. Yet, we are learning about

Zoom calls and being in contact with one another via iPads and Facebook. We are all getting better at using technology we had not used before!

People are amazingly adaptable, but that doesn't keep us from wishing we

could see our friends and family more often. We try to keep positive, but sometimes, we just need a good cry or to talk with someone about how lonely we are. As children of God, we can count on God being with us, even in times

of trial. God gave us tears. In Romans 8:26-27 we read, "The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God."

Have you heard the word, "lament?" The two places in the Bible that we hear about lament are The Book of Psalms and The Book of Lamentations. As humans, we often prefer to read the psalms of praise, and we ignore the psalms of lament. Even in the lectionary, the focus is mostly on the praise psalms.

We miss something if we ignore the psalms of lament. Why? Because it is like ignoring an important part of our lives. There are times that we are not happy; we are sad. We struggle with what it happening in our lives so we need to cry out to God. Letting ourselves lament is a powerful way to work through the tough times.

One of the books I am reading for my class is *Prophetic Lament: A Call for Justice in Troubled Times* by Soong-Chan Rah. He reminds us that as Christians we need more than a theology of celebration. We also need to acknowledge the theology of suffering or we miss the important part of being children of God.



In real life, lament and praise intersect. When we make room for both in our lives, we are better able to take part in the fullness of the gospel message.

Most of us do not spend much time in the Book of Lamentations, we think it is too dark to read when we are sad. My

> guess is that we all have had times where we struggled with life. Sometimes we are too embarrassed to ask for help or even tell our friends how we are feeling because we think we should always be cheerful and positive. Tak-

ing time to read the psalms of lament and the message of Lamentations gives us an awareness that we are not the only people who struggle and don't know what to do.

Try it. Find the psalms that are considered psalms of lament. Some are laments of individuals and others are laments of a community. Find Lamentations and read it. Listen for God's word and know that, whether you are filled with joy or sadness, God always walks with you.
