

## **Betsy Wolfe has compiled credits on Broadway, Carnegie Hall and the Met**

Betsy Wolfe has been traveling the country singing and starring opposite Darren Criss (“Glee”) with their solo and duet show *Broadway Today*. They performed for sold out crowds at The Kennedy Center with the National Symphony, the Toronto Symphony, and Carnegie Hall, performing under Maestro Steven Reineke with New York Pops.

Recently, Wolfe took a break from her symphony performances to perform with Jimmy Buffett at a concert in Miami. This fall Betsy returns to the Broadway stage to co-star in the six-person, highly anticipated revival of “Falsettos.”

Wolfe has appeared on Broadway opposite Zach Braff in the Susan Stroman directed adaptation of Woody Allen’s “Bullets Over Broadway,” as well as in “The Mystery Of Edwin Drood,” “Everyday Rapture” (also off-Broadway) and “110 in the Shade.” She can be heard on all of the original cast albums and can be see “Live on the Today” show with Zach Braff and performing a number from “Bullets over Broadway.”

Last summer, Wolfe starred in the world premiere of “Up Here” at the La Jolla Playhouse, which was written by Kristen Anderson-Lopez and Bobby Lopez the husband and wife team who collectively wrote “Book of Mormon,” “Avenue Q”, “In Transit” and “Frozen.” She also starred in the revival of “The Last 5 Years” Off - Broadway at Second Stage and can be heard on the original cast recording as well. Other regional credits include “Tales of the City” and “The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee” in San Francisco and Boston.

Wolfe made her Metropolitan Opera debut in Douglas Carter Beane’s adaptation of “Die Fledermaus.” She reprised her role this past season for “Die Fledermaus,” marking her return to the Met stage. She has been a guest artist for more than 35 symphonic and pops orchestras, including the New York Philharmonic and Chicago Symphony. Wolfe was also a guest soloist for the New York City Ballet, performing at Lincoln Center and at The Coliseum in London. She can be seen in the film adaptation of “The Last Five Years.”

Wolfe is a native of Visalia who is very familiar to local theatergoers. She performed for the Green Acres Little Theater and went on to star in student productions at Golden West High School, where she graduated in 2000. Wolfe received her formal training at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, where she graduated in 2004.

Wolfe has periodically returned to Visalia to perform, often for fundraising events for local organizations. She will perform at Visalia’s L.J. Williams Theater on Aug. 13.
