



#### December 16, 2018 Third Sunday of Advent Lk 3:10-18

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church Family,

"But what should we do?" Ever heard that? Ever said that? I confess that I ask God daily, "What should I do?" As Jesus' coming approaches, John the Baptist calls all people to change and turn to God. The people who came to John at the Jordan for baptism, wanted to change themselves for the better, but they asked "What should we do, now?" This is a great personal question to ask ourselves in our daily prayer. As we attune ourselves more and more closely to hearing God's voice in every interaction and moment of our days, our proper response to God is to ask, "What should I do now, Lord?" I love the line in our confession prayer at the beginning of each mass which admits our personal sins "in what I have done and in what I have failed to do." This Catholic version of a Sinner's Prayer is my admission that I often fall short of God's grace by not doing something, whether intentionally or not. Traditional Catholic morality identifies both 1) sins of commission (something sinful I actually do) and 2) sins of omission (something I ignore or deliberately do not do, that I should be doing). So when asked by the people, John the Baptist, like a good confessor, points out immoral behaviors they should stop, but also points out additional virtuous behaviors they should not ignore. (A little piece of trivia is that in the pre-Vatican II version of the Confession prayer at Mass, John the Baptist was specifically named along with St Michael, the Virgin Mary and others to help pray for us and motivate us to live holy lives!) So, John the Baptist is our helper to guide us through an examination of conscience as to what good we need to do. John gives some practical directions in his preaching. He basically says in Luke 3:10-14, "We all need to care about others, and share what we have. Everyone needs to practice giving and being generous. Tax collectors, stop the exorbitant commissions and threatening collections. Take only what is fair. And soldiers don't bully your power over others, and exercise responsibly your authority and weapons." John is looking at different occupations and advising each person to prepare in his/her own unique way for Jesus' coming. For example, what a child does to prepare is going to be different than what an adult does to prepare. And for each person's work, following Jesus faithfully may look a little different. John says to us, "Whatever is your state in life, or occupation, be the most Christian at it and be the best at what you do. If you are a soldier, then be a Christian soldier, an honorable and just comrade. If you are a tax collector be courteous in your work and treat people respectfully. If you are a store-market clerk, then smile at people and wish them well. If you are a doctor or nurse, or policeman or mail carrier, then go about your work as a Christian, putting yourself in your customer or client's shoes and work for them as you would want to be served.'

Advent is a great time to prepare for Christ's coming by reviewing our own work and state in life, and changing as we need so that we better reflect Christ in whatever we do. Is it evident that I am a Christian based on my work performance? Do I conduct my business in a Christian manner? So often people excuse themselves in occupations, saying, 'I'm sorry, its only business," Well, whose business? Christ's? I doubt it? As Christians it is not acceptable to try to justify greed or abuse by saying 'it is only my work' Yes, we have to do what we have to do, but we should always have Christ in mind as we go about our duties. I know this happens to people all the time, but I recently had a company change their service and terms out of the blue. They took away part of the plan and just stopped previous services. When I inquired about what they did, they only responded 'Those services migrated to a higher tier' when the company changed names. Well, what it amounted to was that something once costing \$52 now became \$95, so maybe this customer will 'migrate' too! What would John the Baptist say?

We all make choices every day about doing good or not. John the Baptist was helping people prepare for Jesus' coming by having them review their own lives, and asking, "Do I reflect Christ?" We all pray to the Holy Spirit and seek out trusted Christian friends when we face 'decision points' about our lives and work. John was calling his society to be fair with each other. In a way, that is not asking for much, but sometimes it can mean sacrifices that do seem like a lot! So, we pray and look for God to provide the grace for life-changing actions! Prepare, He is coming!
