

On Sunday, March 31<sup>st</sup> we celebrated Easter. The first night of Passover was March 26, 2013. What does Passover have to do with Easter? Passover was instituted by God in the Old Testament. It was to be celebrated every year by the Hebrews to commemorate the shedding of the blood of a lamb to protect the Hebrews from the Angel of death. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20 ESV)

The Gospel itself has been totally distorted in today's Church by leaving us without any responsibility whatsoever, including that of repentance.

As Director of Missions for the GCEPC/ LEPC one would guess that I have a heart for Missions and Evangelism, especially after reading any other articles I've written or have heard me speak. After the massive amounts of grace poured out on me I must share it with others, and I do it on a regular basis with not only addicts, alcoholics, gang members and

others caught up in sinful lifestyles, but also with those considered productive members of society but who don't know Christ

I have serious concerns over what is considered Evangelism and Discipleship today. The typical "evangelistic meeting" or "revival" at a

church falls far short of what Christ meant. We can actually place the blame on Charles Finney for this type of meeting, because this was carried over into the ministries of Billy Sunday, Dwight L. Moody, Billy Graham and a host of others currently using this style of ministry. Persons are brought to the meetings in the hope of listening to a well known preacher and "believing in Christ." They are asked to walk forward during an "alter call" where they are asked to repeat a short prayer after which they are declared saved, and if the preacher is of the "once saved always saved" persuasion they are told that no matter what they do after this they will still get to heaven. No repentance necessary, this "gospel" goes under various names such as the Love Gospel- "God loves you and has a plan for your life", Easy Believism, Fire Insurance or the falsely called Free Gracewhich is really nothing but antinomianism and a license to sin and is condemned by the Apostle *cannot be turned to unless our* Paul :

"What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Romans 6:1-3 ESV)

The Gospel itself has been totally distorted in today's Church by leaving us without any responsibility whatsoever, including that of repentance. As I read it the Bible says:

"Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

(Mark 1:14-15 ESV) or

"And Peter said to them. *"Repent and be baptized every"* one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:38 ESV)

Without repentance-

METANOIA: Greek, from metanoiein to change one's mind, repent, from meta- + noein to think, from nous mind- there can be no salvation *because God* sin and old lifestyle is turned from. We must confess (agree with God) about our lost condition and continuous violation of His Law, and trust in Christ's propitiation and in His righteousness as imputed to us which alone saves us from the wrath coming upon all unbelievers. But believing on Jesus Christ as Savior is not the same as believing in facts about Jesus

"You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe—and shudder!" (James 2:19 ESV)

The true faith is trusting in Christ's death upon the Cross as payment for our sin and in His resurrection as the promise of our resurrection. And being in the faith requires bearing fruit.

*"As for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patience."* 

(Luke 8:15 ESV)

"So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus you will recognize them by their fruits." (Matthew 7:17-20 ESV)

"What is bearing fruit? Essentially, it is becoming like Jesus. Spiritual fruit will show itself in our lives as a change in our character and outlook. As we spend time with Jesus and get to know Him better, His thoughts will become our thoughts. His purpose will become our purpose. We will become like Jesus." Greg Laurie

Let's take a look at what we are actually commanded to do:

1. "**make disciples of all nations**"- there is no place the Gospel is not to be taken, and no place the Name of Jesus is not to be lifted up as Lord and Savior to all mankind. This includes our own city and neighborhood we dwell in. We all know people that do not know Christ, and many who barely know about Him. If we are not proclaiming Christ to them we are sinning by omission and disobeying a direct command of Christ. Also, we need to remember our oath given during our ordination as ministers and priests:

"Are you resolved to build up the Church as the body of Christ and to remain united to it within the order of bishops under the authority of the GCEPC/LEPC? Are you resolved to equip God's people, maintain the bond of unity, encourage maturity and attaining to the fullness of Christ for his Body?" Presentation of the Bishop-Elect

2. "**baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit**" – regardless of our view of Baptism, whether "Believers Baptism" or "Paedobaptism", it is still symbolic of our Baptism into the Body of Christ by the Holy Spirit. It brings us openly into the community of fellow believers. To not be baptized at all is in direct disobedience to Jesus Christ unto whom ALL authority has been bestowed. Those teaching otherwise are in grievous error.

*"but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven."* (Matthew 10:33 ESV)

3. "*teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you*"- Whatever Jesus taught His disciples were given as commands were to be taught to others in order that they too would observe them. This goes against the grain of many "teachers" today who have a false or distorted view of Law and Gospel. Many separate the Law into what only the Jews were to observe while the Gospel is for everyone else, free of commandments. But is this what the Bible teaches? The Apostle John states:

"And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments. Whoever says "I know him" but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him, but whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected. By this we may know that we are in him: whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked."

(1 John 2:3-6 ESV) also Paul states:

"Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law."

(Romans 3:31 ESV)

In his "Introduction to Romans," Luther stated that saving faith is,

"a living, creative, active and powerful thing, this faith. Faith cannot help doing good works constantly. It doesn't stop to ask if good works ought to be done, but before anyone asks, it already has done them and continues to do them without ceasing. Anyone who does not do good works in this manner is an unbeliever... Thus, it is just as impossible to separate faith and works as it is to separate heat and light from fire!"

If our Faith is alive and we desire to truly follow the "Great Commission", we are to make disciples, not "converts. The numbers of "conversions" claimed at crusade and revivals do not add up to the numbers that become active in churches and become true disciples. These numbers are considered to be "*evangelastic*"- a stretching of the reality and truth concerning numbers of conversions. We ought to realize only the Holy Spirit can truly convert a person. As ministers of Christ we ought to be teaching the whole counsel of God and not trying to get people to "receive Christ" by emotional manipulations during an altar call to "show" our effectiveness as ministers and worthiness to pastor a church. Our call is to sow the seed and to water that which is planted. Our assignment is to live out the Faith in the sight of others. But only the Holy Spirit is able bring the conversion and growth in those He has called to Christ. With that settled let us put our hands to the plow and get to work.

Have you ever wondered if God can do anything with the mess in your life? You know the mess.... the mistakes, the abuse, the poor choices, what has happened to you as well as what you have done to others, the hurt, the pain, the loss, the drama, the trauma and anything that seems to take on the look, smell and feel of mess. I assure you He can and He will.

As we come to know the Lord we find that He is weaving a tapestry

of His grace through our life. Once we choose Christ, follow Christ and seek to know Him, obey Him and to be whole in Him our lives begin to take on form and substance and how He keeps us and changes us through the mess of the past and present become a testimony to others.

Many times it is our testimony, our lessons learned, the fact that we are alive and full of His Spirit after all that has happened to us that draws others to Christ. People think that their mess is worse, that God can't and won't forgive or be able to use it. But when they hear and see of how God has taken us from death to life, from alcohol to sobriety, from abuse to healthy relationships, from bitterness to forgiveness, they see hope.

God loves to create beauty from ashes. He loves to show His glory in our lives. He is not a respecter of persons so what He has done in one life He will do in another. This is why He came. Christ stood in the temple and proclaimed:

### The Year of the LORD's Favor

Isaiah 61: <sup>1</sup>The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, <sup>2</sup> to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn,<sup>3</sup> and provide for those who grieve in Zion— to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor.

<sup>4</sup> They will rebuild the ancient ruins and restore the places long devastated; they will renew the ruined cities that have been devastated for generations. <sup>5</sup> Strangers will shepherd your flocks; foreigners will work your fields and vineyards. <sup>6</sup> And you will be called priests of the LORD, you will be named ministers of our God. You will feed on the

wealth of nations, and in their riches you will boast.

<sup>7</sup> Instead of your shame you will receive a double portion, and instead of disgrace you will rejoice in your inheritance. And so you will inherit a double portion in your land, and everlasting joy will be yours. <sup>8</sup> "For I, the LORD, love justice; I hate robbery and wrongdoing. In my faithfulness I will reward my people and make an everlasting covenant with them. <sup>9</sup> Their descendants will be known among the nations and their off-spring among the peoples. All who see them will acknowledge that they are a people the LORD has blessed."

<sup>10</sup> I delight greatly in the LORD; my soul rejoices in my God. For he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness, as a bridegroom adorns his head like a priest, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. <sup>11</sup> For as the soil makes the sprout come up and a garden causes seeds to grow, so the Sovereign LORD will make righteousness and praise spring up before all nations."

The Lord came to turn our mess into our message. He came to proclaim liberty, to rebuild the ancient ruins of our life and make something new. This scripture shouts redemption, restoration and reconciliation to the land and the people. This is not just to the Jews but to the Gentiles, for we are grafted in and receive the same promises.


So don't think that your mess was just something you suffered through. Romans 8:28 "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to *His* purpose." Ask God to show you Himself in the midst of the mess, reflect upon what He has done in you, through you and through others in the mess. Ask for the opportunity and people to share with about how God has and is turning your mess into your message of hope, love, reconciliation, redemption and transformation.

My prayer and blessing for you is that you will discover and uncover the mysteries of God in His ways and His word. I pray for you a revelation of His grace in your life and that all lessons imparted to you through your mess will become revelatory teaching for the flock of God. This is the time of the Lord's favor in your life to turn your ashes into beauty, your mourning into joy and replace your despair with praise, sooner rather than later says the Lord. Life, wholeness and health are yours. Be blessed in knowing that what is your mess is now your message.



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### When Anxiety and Worry Creep Into Our Lives Do We Hear God's Calming Voice?

Luke 10:41-42 (41) The Lord answered her. "Martha. Martha! You worry and fuss about a lot of things. (42) There's only one thing you need. Mary has made the right choice. and that one thing will not be taken away from her."

For some weeks now my Sunday School Class and I have read and discussed Joanna Weaver's book **Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World.** The writing tells of the two sisters we read about in Luke 10: 38-39 and how anxiety and worry appear to enter into the events when Jesus is in their home. In Luke 10:41 the Lord says to Martha, "You are worried and upset about many things." As our class has discussed this and other portions of the book we are coming to realize that anxiety and worry are more a part of our lives than we may realize and in that there are burdens we carry.

The Bible tells us not to worry and it is not a suggestion only but a command. Even knowing this, the "Worry Bug" seems to find its way into our lives. Interestingly, studies suggest that there is nothing we can do with about 70 percent of our worries. Data may tell us we are unable to do much with our worries and that it is a waste of time, yet it seems we find ways to worry anyway. Some suggest we are simply wired-up to worry, and since Adam and Eve this has been our lot as humans. The reality is we are not molded to be fearful. If we want to live healthy lives we have to find ways to address our ongoing anxiety.

In our class discussions we have looked at worry versus concern. When Jesus told us not to worry, that was not to mean that we are not to be concerned. We have looked at worry and its offspring of fear, uneasiness, obsession, calamity, dread and a host of other ills and thought of them as "spiritual termites" that can invade our spiritual being and nibble away at our foundation and structure. We have looked at concern as something legitimate to address. Usually concern is a specific thing and the problem can be addressed and solved at some level. Worry we have decided is usually unfounded and created more of our own design than it is specific. We see worry as a kind of thinking that is generalized to other situations and has us obsess about the problem. As the obsession continues it creates more problems and we look to others or ourselves for answers. As the generalized fear spreads we liken this to "spiritual termites" nibbling away at faith structure. Bit by bit the foundation and structure are weakened and left unchecked, there can be collapse of the structure. The bible tells us to avoid fear and worry because God knows that these invaders take our focus off our relationship with Him and we focus on the situation rather than on our relationship with Him.

When we think of concern and how it is a part of our lives it seems we define it as taking our problems and as specific as they can be defined, we look to God for answers. In this we see how to mitigate against the spiritual termites of fear and anxiety. In our lighter moments, we have looked at this way of conceptualizing our problems as concerns, and this becomes God's way of offering us a detection device to ward off the "spiritual termites."

When we hear God's word as it is expressed through Paul's writing in Philippians 4:6-7, the calming voice is present. Three concise and practical steps are voiced:

- 1. Be anxious about nothing.
- 2. Be prayerful about everything.
- 3. Be thankful for all things.

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

Paul meant every thing he wrote. He is telling us nothing is too great or small in our lives that we cannot bring it to God and fretting only magnifies the problem. Our concerns are to be turned into prayer and are not to be our burdens. Much depends on our perspective and we have a choice that can lead to peace. The ability to focus and be rational comes when we focus on God's voice and His ability to be with us in all things. When we are able to do this we find as Paul wrote in Philippines 4:7, "the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

I offer tribute to Joanna Weaver for her inspiration in making these comments based on her writing and I trust my words will be pleasing in His sight.




### Thinking.....

Thinking about Jesus and His Kingdom...



Things got worse as I was taken to our living area, and realized that I would be spending the next five months living in ten person tents with 6ft by 8ft of personal space, walking thirty yards over rocks to portable shower and latrine trailers, hot showers as the exception not the norm, and so on and so on. I fell asleep that night asking the Lord to grant me strength to stop complaining, to refocus my energy, and to be a visible reminder of His grace and presence.

The next morning, I walked out of my tent, and witnessed a gorgeous sunrise over the mountains right next to us. I traveled with SGT Devick, my faithful Chaplain Assistant and bodyguard, back over to the "barn" (our HQ, where my office is, and yes, it looks like a barn!) I immediately started interacting with soldiers and had my first counseling sessions. By the end of the day, I realized that God has placed me exactly where He wants and needs me to be. Yes, the conditions can be challenging at times. We are in a combat zone, far from family, and all of us leave behind the comforts of home. However, the ministry is amazing and the possibilities are endless! I hear so many people lament that this current generation is going to be the ruin of us; how they are lazy, undisciplined, selfish, etc...well, after

spending time with our gifted soldiers, airmen, and sailors the past two weeks, let me just say that I have nothing but admiration and respect for what these young folks are capable of. Trust me- we are in good hands!

The testimonies I have been blessed to hear are incredibly uplifting, and the examples of discipleship and Christian love that our soldiers display are an example for all of us. As I was preparing for my first worship services late last week, I felt some trepidation. I just didn't know what to expect, and I meditated on Mathew 18:20, and was reminded that even if only 1 soldier shows up for worship, we were going to give all praise and glory to God and" make a joyous noise." SGT Devick asked if he could lead music and try out the praise band that he had recently put together. With a knowing smile and excitement, I told him to go for it, and I could sense the Holy Spirit at work here.

Sunday morning rolled around, and we arrived at the Marmal Chapel about 2 hours early. SGT Devick brought a beautiful guitar he has, two more guitarists showed up, one civilian and one Army, and a drummer, who is Air Force, rounded out the band. As they rehearsed their songs, I was utterly blown away by how good they were, and I was fired up for our services. At 10:30am, dozens and dozens of people from several different countries (this is a NATO base) filed in. We sang songs and rocked out with the band, prayed together, shared communion and peace, and found comfort in the words of promise and hope given to us by our Savior.

As I'm writing this a couple of days later, I'm still glowing from our worship services this past weekend. To think that we have people from all walks of life thrown together on a

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

If my people who are called by *my name*, will humble themselv es and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear them from heaven and forgive their sin and will heal their land. 2 Ch 7:14

As we suffer one tragedy after another tragedy in this country it has become glaringly obvious to me that the words of 2 Chronicles 7:14 ring as loud today as they did in the time of King Solomon.

If my people who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear them from heaven and forgive their sin and will heal their land.

Obviously this passage was not written about modern day America. It was actually a response from God to King Solomon's request in 2 Chronicles Chapter 6 concerning provisions for the people when they sinned.

While this is not a promise specifically to our country, I do believe it is a promise to God's people. We should not exclude ourselves from all promises we find in God's word I do believe we have to carefully look at God's word and discover how it applies to us today in its context of scripture.

If my people who are called by my name

Two concepts are basic here... (1) Israel belonged to God; His name had been called upon them; (2) just like them, we must acknowledge this and submit to his authority.

And pray and seek my face

Not only are they to pray to God, but they are not to settle for less than being admitted into his presence. They must see him.

Turn from their wicked ways

God will not hear the prayer unaccompanied by repentance. Repentance means to turn 180 degrees away from your sin, as well as being remorseful for your sin. Being contrite / sorry for your sins.

Hear... forgive... heal

When once the ear of God is reached, He will not only remove the guilt but will restore to health and usefulness.

- 1. humble yourself by admitting your sins.
- 2. pray to God, asking for forgiveness.
- 3. seek God continually.
- 4. turn from sinful behavior.

True repentance is more than talk- it is changed behavior. Whether we sin individually, as a group, or as a nation, following these steps will lead to forgiveness. God will answer our prayer.

This applies to us today as individuals, as a church, as a nation. We have been blessed as a nation since the beginning of our existence. But God does not love us anymore as a nation than he does any other nation.

What this is saying to us as individuals is that we need to get our life in line with our heavenly Father. This will take true repentance. We are all living lives that fall short of the Glory of God. 

On behalf of the NAE Chaplain Commission Executive Board, I bring you greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Most of you are aware of the recent DoD policy memorandum mandating benefits for same-sex couples by 1 August 2013. The domestic partner of the military member will receive benefits previously afforded solely to military spouses. These benefits include a DoD ID card, commissary privileges, family center programs, joint duty assignments, child care, legal assistance and many other benefits.

While we are saddened by the direction DoD is taking in light of our Evangelical belief in traditional biblical marriage, we are also concerned how this new policy will affect our chaplains who have boots on the ground. It was indeed providential that we were successful in attaching provisions to the 2013 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) protecting chaplains' right to conscience. However, we realize that our chaplains will increasingly need the wisdom of Solomon and the boldness of David in accommodating the religious needs of all those entrusted to their care.

Chaplains, be assured that we will continue to support you as you navigate these unchartered waters. We will continue the fight for biblical values and beliefs inside the Beltway. We will pray that God grants you wisdom, strength and courage for this hour as you endeavor to support all DoD personnel and their families. Hopefully, the traditional accommodation policy will remain in effect where what a chaplain cannot provide directly, can be supported through referral to other available resources.

We rejoice over the reports we consistently receive from our military, VA and institutional chaplains who are bringing vital spiritual care to those who are in dire need of God's love and grace. May our Lord bless you and guide you in the work.

In Hebraic terms "follow" means come after me with the intent of becoming a disciple. Not us making us fishers of men but Jesus making us fishers of men because of who he is, what he knows and all he is capable of doing.
