<b>DISCUSSION</b>	<p>Byron Oedekoven provided an update on the current legislation and issues facing the 2018 legislative session related to the 24/7 Legislation.</p> <p>Natrona County – Started accepting recipients on November 29, 2017. Waiting for judges to start sentencing offenders to the program.</p> <p>Fremont County – Close to starting the program. Looking at the first quarter of 2018 to start in Riverton. Working with Judges in Riverton.</p> <p>Sheridan County - Judge is sentencing already in their jurisdiction using a structure similar to 24/7.</p> <p>Laramie County - Looking to implement in 2018.</p> <p>Campbell County - Started accepting recipients in September 26, 2017. 38 people in program to date. College students administering program as a part-time work force. Media included in the kick-off of the program in Campbell County. Working with employers to meet testing requirements of their employees. Kevin Theis and Sheriff Matheny explained the program in their county.</p> <p>Albany County – Detention staffing shortage is an issue. Still looking to work towards implementation in 2018 with a full detention staff.</p> <p>Teton County – Judges are using a similar system in their county to 24/7 and will not be looking at starting the program until receiving more interest by their judiciary.</p>
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<b>DISCUSSION</b>	Presented the idea that we put ourselves in the shoes of the offender or arrestee in a DUI case. Suggested that incentives be available to those who are drinking to take advantage of a ride sharing technology.
