SECTION 3. That all of the area to be included within the proposed improvement district is entirely within Grand County, Utah, and no part of such area is included within the boundaries of a municipal corporation Southeasterly approx. 1870 ft. to NE Cor., NW 1/4 NW 1/4, Sec. 15, nor within the boundaries of another improvement district created under the provisions of Chapter 6, Title 17, Utah Code Annotated 1953 as amended.

SECTION 4. That the purposes for which the proposed district is created are to immediately construct systems for collection and treatment of sewage and eventually acquire, construct systems for the collection, treatment and distribution of water and to provide the operation of all or any

part of such system or systems, and to provide services thereof to the inhabitants of said improvement district.

SECTION 5. The estimated initial cost of engineering, construction, legal and other fees should not exceed One Million (\$1,000,000.00) Dollars, but this shall not be the limitation and may hereafter be increased as circumstances and necessity requires. The costs are to be covered by a federal grant for approximately 75% of the cost and a bond issue for the balance.

SECTION 6. That on April 8, 1974, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M., the Board of County Commissioners shall meet in their Board room in the County Courthouse in Moab, Utah; and will then and there hold a public hearing at which time and place all parties interested may appear before said board to be heard either in support of or opposition to the creation of the proposed improvement district and of the area proposed to be included therein. Any taxpayer within the area proposed to be included within said improvement district may, on or before said date, protest in writing against creation of the proposed improvement district and against inclusion of the proposed area or any part thereof within such proposed district, which protest shall be signed by the taxpayer or taxpayers thereof and shall be filed with the County Clerk of Grand County in Moab, Utah.

SECTION 7. This Notice is given in accordance with Section 17-6-3, Utah Code Annotated 1953 as amended.

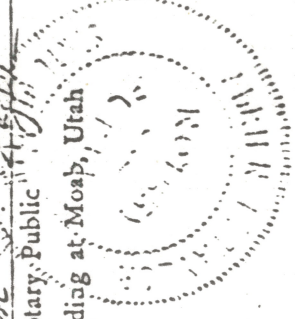

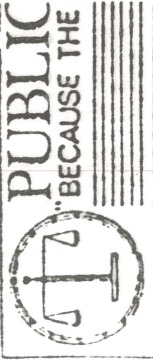

age level by reducing the socioeconomic and adolescent age that is normally present in the traditional junior high and high school structures, and by providing more appropriate activities for middle-school age children.

"The program will attempt," he said, "to change the traditional junior high environment, including attitudes, social values, moral values and so on, and provide sixth school in Littleton, Colorado, also worked with the committee, several of whom visited his school. He will continue as a consultant with local school officials, and will help plan inservice training toward the implementation of the middle school here.

Mr. Meador concluded that the change will not be an easy or a simple one, but that the committee is in agreement that the change will be beneficial in an area where there is a problem. Final Rites He

John J. Knop, 73, died March 14 after a two-month illness, in Allen Memorial Hospital. He was a 20-year Moab resident, State Farm Insurance agent, and known for his love of fishing, hunting and gardening.

Scores of young Moab boys learned the skills and joys of fishing and hunting as a result of John's invitations to come along, and his patience to teach and advise them. John was also deeply dedicated to his Lutheran faith. He was responsible for the founding of Grace Lutheran Church in Moab, and instrumental earlier in the organization of the Boise City, Okla., Lutheran Church and the Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Pratt, Kansas. Daniel Holyoak and D. L. Taylor and seconded by George H. Newell and adopted by the following vote:

The Resolution and Ordinance is as follows:

Resolution determining and declaring that the public health convenience and necessity requires the creation of Spanish Valley Water and Sewer Improvement District of the area in the ordinance described all within Grand County, State of Utah, and notice to create such improvement district.

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners on the 4th day of March 1974 approved a Resolution declaring that the public health convenience and necessity required the establishment of an improvement district within Grand County, Utah and

WHEREAS the County Commissioners of Grand County published notice of intention to establish an improvement district including the area described in said notice and to be known as the Spanish Valley Water and

Sewer Improvement District, and

WHEREAS said notice provided that a public hearing be held on the 8th day of April 1974 at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. in the Board room in the Court House in Moab, Utah at which time all interested parties may appear before the board to be heard either in support of or in opposition to the proposed improvement district, and

WHEREAS said notice was published in the Times Independent, a weekly newspaper of general circulation for four successive weeks beginning on the 14th day of March 1974 and ending on the 4th day of April 1974, and

WHEREAS on the 8th day of April 1974, said public hearing was held, and after investigation and consideration of all the circumstances the Board of County Commissioners has determined that the public health, convenience and necessity require the creation of the Spanish Valley Water and Sewer Improvement District in order to provide for water and sewer and preserve the health, promote the prosperity, improve the morals, peace and order, comfort and convenience of Grand County, State of Utah, and the inhabitants thereof and in order to carry into effect the provisions of chapter 6, title 17, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and good cause appearing the Board of County Commissioners of Grand County adopt an Ordinance as follows:

1. There is hereby established and created under Chapter 6, Title 17, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended, the Spanish Valley Water and Sewer Improvement District, which district shall include all the property and lands described in the notice of intention to establish the Spanish Valley Water and Sewer Improvement District within Grand County, published in the Times Independent on March 14th, March 21st, March 28th and April 1974.

2. All the functions, activities, and responsibilities of the Spanish Valley Water and Sewer Improvement District shall be performed and carried out in accordance with and subject to Chapter 6, Title 17, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended, and other applicable law.

3. The County Commissioners have determined that the interest in the district would be best served by the appointment of a Board of

Five trustees to serve for the same term as is provided for elected trustees. The following persons are appointed to serve as trustees of the

Spanish Valley Water and Sewer Improvement District:
