Bankruptcy 101:

The two types of bankruptcy that most people hear about are chapter 7 and chapter 13. The word chapter refers to the chapter (like in a book) in the bankruptcy code. Chapter 7 is a liquidating bankruptcy and chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy. Liquidating means they (the government) can take your stuff. Non-liquidating means they can't. However, there are exceptions to this. I will try to lay this out in a simplistic fashion:

In a chapter 7 you will be able to discharge all of your debts without

paying anything back. However, if you have any equity in anything (your home, your car, your bank account, your boat- anything) you must surrender it to the bankruptcy trustee (the person who looks out for the creditors) so that it can be sold (liquidated) to pay back the creditors to the largest extent possible. Equity is what determines which chapter of bankruptcy you can file under. Fair Market Value minus Amount Owed equals Your Equity in anything.

A chapter 13 is a non-liquidating

bankruptcy. This means you get to keep everything, but you have to pay back a percentage of your equity. It is also used for people who are in foreclosure or behind on their mortgage and in fear of foreclosure. A chapter 13 requires a payback plan from between three to five years. The payment is monthly. The amount is determined, again, by the amount of equity you have accumulated in your life. This is referred to as your bankruptcy estate. Obviously, everyone wants to do a chapter 7 because it is no pay back. However, since 2005 it has become much harder to file chapter 7. In 2005, legislation was passed which tightened up the income restrictions on people with regard to the Chapter 7 bankruptcy. The intended result was that more

people must file under Chapter 13 of the Bankruptcy code and pay back, at least, what the government thinks they can afford.

It is the bankruptcy attorney's job to advise you which is the best chapter to file under. It is also the attorney's job to make sure you keep your home, your car, and everything else you have accumulated throughout your life.



Lake County Genealogical Society Meeting - November 18th

The Lake County Genealogical Society (LCGS) meeting will be held on November 18 from 10:00 am to approximately noon. Please note that we are meeting early in the month due to the Thanksgiving Holiday, and that we do not have a December meeting. The LCGS has been meeting on Zoom due to COVID-19. Please join us for a short business meeting followed by our speaker, Deborah Abbott.

Deborah Abbott will be talking "Using Manuscript about. Collections Genealogy in Research. Researching manuscripts, oral histories, and special collections in libraries, archives and other repositories are overlooked sources. Manuscript collections often are not indexed, and it takes time and patience to sift through the various documents that you might find. Knowing exactly where and what will be found in a manuscript collection can be tricky, but when found, they can create a gold mine of information pertaining to your ancestors.'

"Deborah A. Abbott, PhD, is a professional genealogist, specializing in African American research, manuscript collections and genealogy methodology. She serves as a member of the Cuyahoga County (Ohio) Archives Advisory Commission. She is an associate with the Kentucky-Tennessee Associates based in Springfield, TN; past president of the African American Genealogical Society, Cleveland, OH; and a retired

professor of Counseling from Cuyahoga Community College in Cleveland... Dr. Abbott is an instructor as well as the coordinator for both the weeklong African American tracts at the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research (IGHR) held at the University of Georgia in Athens, GA and the Genealogy Research Institute of Pittsburgh held at LaRoche University in Pittsburgh, PA. LCGHD is Offering Free Private Well Water Testing The Lake County General

Health District (LCGHD) is offering free private/residential well water samples on Tuesdays from October through the end of December. There are a limited amount of samples that will be available each Tuesday by calling (440) 350-2543. Appointments will be scheduled on a first-comefirst-served basis. A laboratory that is certified and approved for drinking water tests is used for processing the test. *Water samples* for home sale transactions are not eligible for this promotion.

LCGHD is encouraging homeowners to have their well water tested regularly. Private residential wells are often shallower than large volume public supply wells and more open to contamination. Unlike public supply wells, private wells are not regulated under the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Act.

"Many well owners do not regularly test their well water quality, and it's important that they have all the information they

need to make the best decisions to protect their well water and their health," commented LCGHD Chris Loxterman, Environmental Health Supervisor. LCGHD recommends that private well owners test their well water each year for contaminants, such as total coliform bacteria and other contaminants that may be of concern in your area. A homeowner may test more often if a problem is suspected.

As fall migration winds down, Blackbrook Audubon invites everyone to hear "Monitoring Evolving Bird Migration: Technologies and Remarkable Discoveries" by Dr. Andy Jones of the Cleveland Museum of Natural History. This free presentation will be 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, November 16 at Geauga Park District's The West Woods Nature Center.

Banding birds and reporting sightings on eBird continue to help in understanding bird migration, but the array of available technologies to ornithologists is constantly changing. 

Plans that participate in this model will offer coverage choices that include multiple types of insulin at a maximum copayment of \$35 for a 30-day supply.
