Sunday Reflection: Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

What is the significance of Jesus' beatitudes, and why are they so central to his teaching? The beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness that God has placed in every heart. They teach us the final end to which God calls us, namely the coming of God's kingdom (Matthew 4:17), the vision of God (Matthew 5:8), entering

into the joy of the Lord (Matthew 25:21-23) and into his rest (Hebrews 4:7-11). Jesus' beatitudes also confront us with decisive choices concerning the life we pursue here on earth and the use we make of the goods he puts at our disposal.

The beatitudes which Jesus offers us are a sign of contradiction to the world's understanding of happiness and joy. How can one possibly find happiness in poverty, hunger, mourning, and persecution? Poverty of spirit finds ample room and joy in possessing God as the greatest treasure possible. Hunger of the spirit seeks nourishment and strength in God's word and Spirit. Sorrow and mourning over wasted life and sin leads to joyful freedom from the burden of guilt and spiritual oppression. God reveals to the humble of heart the true source of abundant life and happiness. Jesus promises his disciples that the joys of heaven will more than compensate for the troubles and hardships they can expect in this world. Thomas Aquinas said: "No one can live without joy. That is why a person deprived of spiritual joy goes after carnal pleasures." Do you know the happiness of hungering and thirsting for God alone?

Saint of the Week St. John Bosco

John Melchior Bosco, also known as Don Bosco, was born in 1815 in Italy. He was ordained a priest in 1841. As a young priest, he recognized the ill-effects of industrialization and urbanization, and dedicated his life to the betterment and education of disadvantaged youth. His teaching method was a preventive system based on love rather than punishment, and placed the students in surroundings removed from the likelihood of committing sin. He combined catechetical training and fatherly guidance, seeking to unite the spiritual life with work, study and play.



Feast Day: January 31

Don Bosco opened a school for boys called the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales. Through the generosity of wealthy patrons, he was able to provide shoemaking and tailoring workshops for the students. The school later added a printing press for publication of religious pamphlets.

In 1859, John gathered 17 men and founded the Salesians of Don Bosco, and later the Salesian Sisters of Don Bosco. Both groups' activities concentrated on education and mission work.

St. John Bosco was canonized in 1934 and is the patron saint of youth, educators and editors.

Our local food pantry is always in need of items like pasta, sauce, soups, canned vegetables and canned fruit.


Food for Thought

Four Chaplains Memorial Service

Each year on February 3, we celebrate Four Chaplains Day honoring four military chaplains who sacrificed their own lives to save the lives of fellow service members during WWII. This year marks the 80th anniversary of the sinking of the U.S. Army Transport Dorchester while transporting troops to an American base in Greenland. A German U-boat fired a torpedo that struck the Dorchester, killing 672 of the 902 persons aboard. Many of the survivors owe their lives to the courage and leadership shown by four chaplains of different faiths. As the ship sank, the chaplains were seen linked arm in arm, praying.
