RULES AND REGULATIONS

 All test papers <u>must</u> be signed by a parent or guardian and returned the next school day. Your signature serves as verification that you have seen the form—please do not tell the child that you refuse to sign because the school must have confirmation that you are aware of what the student is or is not doing on a daily basis.

- 2. All Progress Reports and Report Cards must be signed and returned within three school days.
- 3. Current immunization records or any other pertinent medical information must be submitted before the beginning of the school year.
- 4. Hardback textbooks must be covered at all times. Proper-fitting book covers (no cloth covers) are to be used.
- 5. Parents <u>must</u> write a note upon the pupil's return to school after an absence. An absence of 3 days or more requires a note from the doctor. <u>Excessive absenteeism (more than fourteen days per school year) will result in the student repeating a grade</u>, unless the student's medical condition warrants exception as determined by the principal.
- 6. Pupils absent from school must call a telephone buddy for the assignments or call the school office to arrange for the assignment and books to be picked up after 3:00 PM. Absence from school does not exonerate a pupil from this responsibility. Pupils absent from school may not participate in any after-school activity.
- Only a medical affidavit will exonerate a pupil from Physical Education. Running is allowed <u>only</u> during the <u>Physical</u> <u>Education</u> period.
- 8. All pupils must perform their <u>own</u> preparation for class—only with the principal's permission will parental intervention be condoned.
- 9. Questions in reference to a pupil's academic or disciplinary format must first be directed to the teacher or teachers in question.
- 10. There is to be no gum or gum chewing on school property.
- 11. Any deviation from the normal routine for dismissal must be made in writing and directed to the teacher's attention. The teacher will notify the office of the dismissal change. <u>There will</u> <u>be no exceptions! Parents should not call the office for</u> <u>dismissal changes unless it is an emergency.</u>
- 12. There will be no parties in the upper elementary—the one exception being Christmas.
- 13. Electronic devices, cell phones, beepers, i-pods, MP3 players, animals, etc. are <u>not</u> to be brought to school.
- 14. Inasmuch as Internet access is unavailable to the students at school, parents are fully responsible for any Internet issues involving their children, and Lake Castle School shall not be brought into ANY matter involving the Internet, text messaging, e-mailing, posting, or other related communication.
- 15. Parents are to meet with a teacher during the teacher's off period <u>by appointment only</u>.
- Children are to arrive at school between 8:00 and 8:30 A.M. (unless the child is brought to before-school care, which begins at 6:30 A.M.). Parents are <u>not</u> to bring children to the classroom.
- THE FULL UNIFORM, INCLUDING PROPER SHOES FOR BOYS AND GIRLS, MUST BE WORN BY EVERYONE EVERY SCHOOL DAY (see the SCHOOL UNIFORM RULES).

- 18. Boys' hair must be short—no hair over ears, eyebrows, or shirt collar. Boys' hair must have a gradual tapering. Boys' and girls' hair must be <u>natural color</u>. Anyone not wishing to conform to this rule should withdraw—those attending Lake Castle must live by the rule. THIS ALSO APPLIES TO ANY HAIR STYLE VIOLATING THE SPIRIT OF THE RULE—MOHAWK, WEDGE, ONE SIDE LONGER THAN THE OTHER, ABRUPT CHANGES IN HAIR LENGTH, EXTENSIONS, HAIR DYEING/STAINING, USE OF SUN-IN, ETC. NO HAIR GEL. No excessive or large accessories.
- 19. Fingernails must be natural and short. Sculptured nails and fingernail polish are not allowed.
- 20. No student may be dropped off for any school function (ex. Fun Fest, athletic events, chess tournaments, etc.) and remain unsupervised. A parent MUST accompany the student at any school function. This rule does not include students who are participating in an after-school activity and are being coached or moderated by designated adults. This rule DOES include spectators and siblings of participants.
- 21. More than three detentions per Progress Report period will result in a parent/principal or parent/assistant principal conference. At the principal's discretion, the student may be **suspended** (parent shall immediately pick up the student from school and the student is not allowed to return to school until a time designated by the principal), or **permanently dismissed** (parent shall immediately pick up the student from school and the student is not allowed to return to school) from Lake Castle.
- 22. Any student arriving after the 8:30 A.M. bell is tardy. Tardy students must receive a tardy slip from the office before they report to class. Additionally, tardy students are to bring their lunch to school. Lunch orders are not taken after the 8:30 bell. Tardy students will be excused with an original dated and signed doctor's excuse.
- 23. Pupils will be given detentions for the following reasons:a. Misbehavior
 - b. Incomplete homework or no homework
 - c. Dress code violation
 - d. Tardy four times in one quarter

After-care charges will apply for detention time.

- 24. Only <u>emergency</u> calls will be delivered to pupils. Changes in time or venue must be quieted before pupils leave for school. **STUDENTS MAY NOT CALL FROM SCHOOL FOR BOOKS AND ASSIGNMENTS**.
- 25. Any and all medications (either prescription or over-thecounter) must be brought to the office or teacher BY THE PARENT and never at any time is the medication to be in the child's possession. A "Request for Administering Medication at School and Release from Liability" form (completed and signed) must accompany ANY medication (this form can be obtained from the school office).
- 26. Student's picture and name may be published unless a refusal form (which may be obtained in the office) is completed by a parent/guardian.

FINAL DECISIONS ON ANY DISCIPLINE QUESTIONS WILL BE AT THE PRINCIPAL'S DISCRETION.

It is our foremost recommendation that any medication be administered by a parent at home, or that a parent comes to school to administer medication to his/her child. In extraordinary circumstances, medication may need to be administered at school. In that case, our procedure is as follows:

1. No medication shall be administered without an order from a licensed physician, dentist, or other authorized prescriber. The "Request for Administering Medication at School and Release from Liability" form shall accompany the order.

2. Our administration will administer ONLY what a parent has brought directly to the office clearly marked with the child's name and specific instructions. These instructions are to be distinctly set forth on the school's **"Request for Administering Medication at School and Release from Liability"** form, which is to be completed, signed, and dated by the parent or guardian of the child, and by the child's physician. This form can be obtained from the school office. No over-the-counter medication will be administered by the office without a physician's specific authorization set forth on the form.

At NO time shall any child be allowed to have in his/her possession ANY medication whatsoever. This includes throat lozenges, cough drops, eye drops, etc.
 If a child has any medical condition that arises while at school, such as headache, cramping, earache, itchy skin, etc., the parent will be called and the parent may either pick up the child or come to school to administer the medication.

5. Unless otherwise indicated on the medication form, all medication will be destroyed if it is not picked up within two weeks of the date of the form.
