SEPTEMBER MISSION AND OUTREACH

A HUGE "Thank You" to all who donated diapers and wipes for Churches

United during June and July. We collected a total of 1,174 diapers, including swimmers and training pants, and 5,148 wipes. Good job! They were delivered on August 6, and received with overwhelming gratitude.

Our August focus is Bdecan Presbyterian Church in Tokio ND, on the Spirit Lake Reservation. We are collecting money to purchase winter clothing for the students who have long bus rides to and from school each day. Donations can be made in person by using the pew envelopes or writing "Bdecan" in the memo line of your check; or online through the church website, indicating that it is a mission donation. We have a goal of collecting \$1,500 towards the \$6,000 the Mission Team estimates they need. There is also a bin in the narthex for any new or gently used items you may have.

Our September focus will be PATH. Each year a number of their clients "age out" from the foster system, and PATH tries to provide the items these young adults need to set up their first apartments and succeed in life. Some suggested items include: dishes, cups and glasses, flatware, pots and pans, kitchen utensils, small appliances like toasters and coffee makers, towels for the kitchen or bathroom, sheets and pillowcases, mattress pads, pillows, bedspreads or comforters, cleaning supplies, paper products like toilet tissue and paper towels; the list goes on.

If you are unsure what to buy, Boots Misheski has again agreed to be your personal shopper. Let's see how many of these young people who had a rocky start we can set up for a better chance at success!

PASTOR SEARCH UPDATE: YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

As the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) previously mentioned, our local presbytery posted our full-time pastor position along with our CPC's profile on its website. We too have placed both on our website. The current procedure from the PC(USA) is to match pastors with the profile the PNC has developed. The procedure up to this point has not garnered the interest we had hoped. Like so many professions, enrollment to seminary schools has decreased over the past few years. The average time it takes nationwide to fill a pastor position is 12-18 months. Although we're very proud of our state, community, and church, it can be difficult for someone who has never experienced the upper Midwest to make a commitment to move.

After our last meeting with our Presbytery advisor, Rev. Sarah Bigwood, the PNC discussed other options for getting the word out about our open pastor po-During that discussion, it occurred to us that some of us may know or were related to local pastors. We decided that networking with them may help us find a pastor who is already familiar with ND (and its winter weather!). In keeping with that idea, we want to ask for the congregation's help. If you know a pastor(s), please consider reaching out to them and let them know we have a full-time position available and ask them to pass the information along to their fellow colleagues.
